A MESSAGE FROM 1VDG CATHY



Happy Fall Lions, Lioness and Leos,

A chill is in the air now in the early mornings as we get our children off to school. October is Vision Awareness month for us as members of Lions Clubs International. Our organization has worked tirelessly to eradicate river blindness around the world with one small pill. We also serve our communities with our vision screenings. Our district now has a "Spot" camera for each of our four districts to do vision screenings wherever a need has been identified.

The Welch Allen Spot cameras are so very easy to use. Who in your club has done a vision screening? We can get you trained within five minutes on how to use the camera and then print out the results of the screening. Children as young as six months can be screened. Amblyopia, also known as lazy eye, is one of the most easily correctable vision problems with a vision exam. It is important to get this eye defect treated early so the weak eye can be corrected properly by an eye care professional. This year 15 October is World Sight Day so please be sure your family members have a vision screening this year. A chart screening at school is not enough to identify any internal eye issues.

GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM MESSAGE

Welcome to October and our official entry into the Fall season. Thank you for taking the time to read this month's message about membership even as football is swinging in into gear and your clubs are organizing and hosting your fall events. This month, I'd like to talk to you about the Lions Clubs International (LCI) North American Membership Initiative (NAMI).

I was fortunate to attend the USA/Canada Lions Leadership Forum in Spokane, WA. Our 2nd International Vice President Brian Sheehan shared the following details about this membership to strengthen membership in USA and Canada. While Lions Clubs International has experienced growth over the past 35+ years, the number of Lions in North America has declined over that period. In fact, the last time that we had a positive net growth in the USA was in 1983 (and 1984 for Canada).

I'm sure that you have insight into some of the reasons of this decline, but for some perspective, over that time, Americans are having 43% fewer family dinners, and 35% fewer people have friends just drop by. We've heard it before, but the way that we live our lives is changing and we can't run our clubs the same old way to keep up. So what is Lions Clubs International doing to help us change this trend?

First of all, this initiative will be more than for just one or two years. The intent is to change the way we run our clubs from here forward. So it's not changing our habits like going on a diet and then going back to our old ways. It's changing our habits for the long term so we adjust to our world as it is. There will not be one prescribed way to do this for all clubs - each club and each district knows best what is needed in their own areas. However, we're going to need ideas and guidance on how to apply change where we live.

LCI has already been working with various districts around the US and Canada to pilot some new ideas and approaches. The results are promising, but we'll be hearing more about next steps soon. While there is no one-size fits all set of steps; there are some guideposts to be followed in this initiative:

- 1. Club and District-focused change will be focused for each district and its clubs
- 2. Simple the approach won't be complicated it needs to be simple so as to not confuse our clubs and leaders

 Accountable - all club and district members have to be accountable if we want to grow to serve the needs of our communities

The high-level district process is outlined here:

- 1. Leader commitment
- 2. District and Club Discovery get ideas on how to improve
- 3. Plan Development
- 4. Club Commitment
- 5. Plan Execution

For now, I just want to whet your appetite and provide some awareness. Our district Global Action Team (GAT) will be communicating as we get more guidance and will be reaching out to all of our clubs to communicate with all of you. You don't have to wait for this initiative to get traction, though. You're already doing great work with recruiting new members and I hope that you're considering adjusting as necessary to meet the needs of your newer members. PDG Jan Adams (retention) and I are here to assist you, whether you need assistance with member orientation, retention, recruiting, or whatever.

So keep your eyes and ears open as we learn more and share with you. I also want to encourage you because I know that our clubs continue to do great work each and every year.

NORTHEAST PA LIONS SERVICE FOUNDATION

The Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation board of directors has been quite active since the beginning of this Lion year, updating by laws and operations manuals and most importantly, awarding \$49,903 in grants since July. District 14 T received two grants, \$4,000 to Penbrook Lions and \$4,536 to Ickesburg Lions. These patient care grants enable two girls, aged six and eight, to get much needed vision therapy that their insurance plans do not cover. Additional grants include NeuEyes glasses, a mechanical swimming pool lift, Spot vision screener and \$5000 to 'Cribs for Kids'.

Two new board members have joined us, PDG Bill Tuttle (14T) and PDG Bob Dunne (14G). We are grateful for the skills, judgment and passion they bring to our mission.

The NEPALSF provided a luncheon and presentation at the August State Council Meeting in Harrisburg to further educate district governors and vice district governors on how we can help Lions clubs serve. Information about grant guidelines and application forms can be found at *nepalsf.org* or through your district's board representative.

The Orbisonia Lions club graciously hosted us for a working retreat in August and we were able to enjoy the walking trail recently completed with the help of a community project grant from NEPALSF. It is a great addition to their community.

The board of directors extends their gratitude to all the clubs that have donated funds. \$6,355 was received in club or district donations for the 2018-2019 Lions year from the nine districts that we represent. Your donations enable us to continue to serve the Lions that serve our communities.



HERSHEY LIONS



Members of the Hershey Lions Club are partnering with one of its own members for a very important cause called the 5K for Trey planned for Saturday, October 12, 2019. In October 2018, Lion Brent Schultz's son, Trey, 24, succumbed to an infectious disease called Mycobacterium Abscessus. In 2018, this disease, along with other infectious diseases, took the lives of over 100,000 Americans, with cases in the U.S. growing steadily over the past 5-years. The 5K for Trey will raise funds to benefit research at the Milton S. Hershey Medical Center to find effective treatment options for infectious diseases, like the one that took Trey's life. It will also raise awareness in the community about the lack of funding and research in this area. Trey Schultz started having headaches, vomiting, and inability to swallow in July of 2018 and had his first of 12-brain surgeries in September. He passed away on October 24th, after 41-days in the hospital or in hospice. His dad, Lion Brent Schultz, was inspired to make a lasting legacy in Trey's name to help prevent others from having similar experiences.

Lion Brent approached the Hershey Lions Club about a partnership for this event. "The Lions Club has been known for its service worldwide for over 100-years, and for 75-years in the Hershey community," related Schultz. "Since I am a club member and my daughter is as well, it made sense to partner with the Hershey Lions," added Schultz. The Hershey Lions Club invites the community to help make a difference in this cause. The 5k run/walk event is taking place on the grounds of the Hershey Medical Center at 30 Hope Drive, Hershey, PA 17033, on Saturday, October 12, 2019, from 8:00 AM to 12:00 noon. Runners and walkers are invited to this family-themed event. Tee shirts will be available for the first 150-registrants.

Registration begins at 8:00 AM, with a short program at 8:30 AM, and the race beginning promptly at 9:00 AM. Participants are encouraged to arrive early to pick up race bibs and receive pre-race instructions. This will be a timed event and medals will be given out to winners of various age classes. The course will be mostly flat with low-grade hills, starting in the parking lot of 30 Hope Drive, along Cherry Drive, then onto 322 to Centerview Drive, around the parking garage and following the same route back to 30 Hope Drive. There will also be a silent auction with sports memorabilia. Additional volunteers for the event are invited as well. WEST HANOVER Provides Scholarships and Grants

Again this school year, the West Hanover Township Lions Club will support local students with two \$1,000 scholarships and two \$500 grants.

The scholarships are for students with visual impairments and for grads pursuing higher education in a program related to environmental studies. The vision and environmental scholarships are available to graduates who reside in the area covered by the CD School District regardless of the school they attend, or even if they are home-schooled. Interested seniors can get info and an application at the Central Dauphin High School College and Career Center, and on the Central Dauphin School District web site.

In addition to the annual scholarships, the West Hanover Lions are continuing to provide two \$500 grants for the Central Dauphin Vision and Autism Support Programs.


