Happy Fall Lions, Lioness and Leos,

November is finally here. I'm sure you are all beginning to think about Thanksgiving and the family and friends around your table and while I'm thinking of this day too, I am also thinking about diabetic friendly side dishes and dessert. The focus from Lions Clubs International this month is on Diabetes Awareness and is part of our Global Service Framework.

Many of us are diabetic, including me. I am a type two diabetic and maintain my condition by taking medication, not insulin, and I only test my blood sugar once a day. Type one diabetes is a result of your pancreas not creating insulin properly. When you have this type of diabetes you must take insulin every day and monitor your blood sugar levels many times throughout the day. Often diabetes is a hereditary disease, but not always.

Where do we find new Lions?



We all have personal networks, and that's the best place to start. Sharing what you like about being a Lion with your family, close friends, coworkers, and other groups to which you belong is the safest feeling and most comfortable. You can share your photos and club events on Facebook to connect with people who know you. Think about the people you know at your church who are service-minded. You have a far-reaching network, so why not invite them to a meeting or club event as your guest? I know a PDG who has sponsored numerous Lions by inviting to pick a friend up, pay for their meal, and drop them back off at home.

I continue to recommend the Just Ask! Guide, but some other ideas for finding members are:

- 1. Lists your club already maintains such as donors or people who have volunteered with your club.
- 2. Other organizations that may have partnered with your club.
- 3. Businesses in your community that share values with your club.
- 4. Holding a brainstorming session with your club.
- 5. Local businesses in your community.

When it comes to local businesses, there are opportunities to visit and talk to the business owners. It might be a little intimidating at first, but you only need to ask for a few minutes. Managers at banks, owners of small businesses, and funeral directors are just some potentials. Often, banks require their managers to join service organizations and pay for their dues.

Without going much further, there are lots of places to look for new members. Don't forget to talk to women and younger members (who may even be in their 40's and 50's) in your family and community. If you hear that some younger folks like millennials don't ever volunteer, don't you believe them. Not everyone will want to serve, but it's not because of their age or because they're different from you. And once you have new demographics of members in your club, you'll have an even larger network to find new members.

These are just some ideas. I challenge you to be positive and share your experience. You can get other ideas by looking at Lions forum groups on Facebook, or talk to friends you know in other clubs and districts. If you need help getting started, I can also come speak with your club.

So as we edge closer to Thanksgiving, don't forget those in need in your community and work together to continue to bring new members and new ideas into your club for now and the future.

At their October, 2019, meeting the New Bloomfield Lions Club celebrated the award of \$4536.00 in behalf of Kaylee Weibley and her parents Shane and Melissa Weibley, to cover the cost of specialized eye treatments for Kaylee. PDG David C. McCluskey received the initial request for funds from Lion Tom Wagner, a member of New Bloomfield Lions Club and Kaylee's grandfather. The family needed funds to secure important eye treatments not covered by their insurance. PDG Dave worked with Kathy Nearly to secure a grant from Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation. Total funds needed were \$4536.00 NEPALSF awarded 80% of this total. The Ickesburg Lions Club, home club of Kaylee's residence, and the New Bloomfield Lions Club, each contributed 10% to complete the monies required for Kaylee's treatment. The prompt response from NEPALSF and the rapid cooperation of the two local clubs resulted in a 10% discount and ensured that the entire cost was paid prior to the start of treatment.


LOWER PAXTON LIONS
