GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM MESSAGE

Season's Greetings and Merry Christmas to District 14-T!

As you're planning for gift giving this year, why not consider a gift that you can give to your club and your community. All right, I'm sure that you've realized that I'm talking about membership - after all, that's the purpose of this column. However, how can we shop for the gift of membership for our clubs and communities?

Last month I shared some ideas on where and how to look for prospective members. This month I want to share some ideas for inviting prospective members to come learn about your club and the work that you do. Here are? approaches:

1. Conduct a Lions Informational Meeting
2. Invite your prospective member to a service activity
3. Bring your prospective member to a club meeting

Lions Informational Meeting

This is a great way to share your club message with community leaders, family members, and other prospective members. Ask everyone in your club to think of individuals whom they can invite. Set a date and then look at ways to promote it and plan your presentation. Promotion can include postings in local newspapers, Facebook events, and postcards to those whom you'd like to attend.

For the content of your meeting, here's where you need some preparation. As we've discussed before, it's helpful to have a club brochure, or at least a single page that lists all of the things that you do for your community, how you raise money, and where your money goes. Ask someone in your club who is friendly and engaging to present a short program to review this information with the attendees. It's always helpful to have pictures to connect with your audience. Make sure that you have a follow-up with the attendees such as sharing a business card or some way to get in contact with your club.

Service Activity

A compelling way to help prospective members commit to becoming a Lion is to show them what being a Lion is all about - service. Ask your friend or family member to help you at an event. You don't have to ask them to commit to anything more than a few hours because you need some extra hands. This gives them a chance to become familiar with some of your members and you can share tidbits about being a Lion during the event. Once the event is over, contact them to see if they'd like to learn more and either ask them to help with another event or attend a meeting as a guest. I actually volunteered with my club for a few years before I became a member!

Club Meeting

You can always invite a prospective member to a "regular" club meeting, but this might not be the most motivational for a new member. If you choose this path, consider a meeting where you have an active and engaging program such as a fundraiser (such as assembling sub sandwiches), have a speaker on a cause that's supported by Lions, or a member orientation program. Again, be sure to contact them afterward to give them an opportunity to stay connected.

There's no one way to help a prospective member on a possible path to being a Lion, but these are a few ideas. If you have some of your own, please share them with me - I'd love to hear them!

As always if you need any assistance with one of these options, please contact me and I'll do my best to help.

NEW BLOOMFIELD LIONS

At their October 2019, meeting the New Bloomfield Lions Club celebrated the award of \$4536.00 in behalf of Kaylee Weibley and her parents Shane and Melissa Weibley, to cover the cost specialized eye treatments for Kaylee. PDG David C. McCluskey received the initial request for funds from Lion Tom Wagner, a member of New Bloomfield Lions Club and Kaylee's grandfather. The family needed funds to secure important eye treatments not covered by their insurance. PDG Dave worked with Kathy Nearly to secure a grant from Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation. Total funds needed were \$4536.00 NEPALSF awarded 80% of this total.

The Ickesburg Lions Club, home club of Kaylee's residence, and the New Bloomfield Lions Club, each contributed 10% to complete the monies required for Kaylee's treatment. The prompt response from NEPALSF and the rapid cooperation of the two local clubs resulted in a 10% discount and ensured that the entire cost was paid prior to the start of treatment.

HERSHEY LIONS ATTEND EYE SCHOOL

Derry Township, PA -- Members of the Hershey Lions Club attended the Penn State Eye Center's Eye School held at the Hershey Country Club on November 9, 2019. This educational outreach event is traditionally held in November. Last year's event outgrew its venue and relocated to the Hershey Country Club for this year.

The Eye School is sponsored by the Lions of District 14-T, which includes the Hershey Lions Club and covers the counties of Dauphin, Franklin, Juniata, and Perry, and encompasses Lions, Lioness, and Leo Clubs. The Penn State Eye Center is led by David A. Quillen, MD, Director. The Eye Center's mission includes patient care, education, research, and community outreach. The Eye School is part of that outreach and consists of vision related topics delivered by Penn State Eye Center care providers.

Eye School attendee and Hershey Lion Club president Bart Callear found the presentation on "Common Eye Disorders affecting the Retina" particularly interesting. "It was amazing to see a surgical procedure performed from the surgeon's view." Callear added "all of the topics were very informative and very well presented."

A total of 87-registrants attended this year's Eye School. Attendees included community members, patients, students, health care workers, volunteers, and Lions. The Hershey Lions were joined by Lions from other clubs including the Landisburg Lions, Lower Paxton Twp. Lioness Lions, Lower Paxton Twp. Lions, and the Paxtang Lions. Special guests joining the Lions were Past International President of Lions Clubs International (LCI) Lion Al Brandel and his partner in service, Lion Dr. Maureen Murphy.

Lions Clubs were founded in 1917 and in 1925 became dedicated to eradicating blindness when Helen Keller challenged the Lions to become "knights of the blind." Since then, Lions have worked tirelessly to aid the blind and visually impaired. The Hershey Lions Club meets on the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays at 6:15 pm at the Grace United Methodist Church located at 433 E. Main Street in Hummelstown. Lions clubs are a group of men and women who identify needs within the community and work together to fulfill those needs. For more information visit our website at www.hersheylions.org. Did you know the Vision Resources of Central Pennsylvania (VROCP) provides streaming Audio Services, with programming selected for the visually impaired. Give it a listen some time if you have a device that allows you to access the internet, the web address is www.vrocp.org and once you are on the front page of the VROCP website click on the Listen Live on the right-hand side of the page, near the top.

Each weekday is unique programming starting at 9:00 a.m. with two hours of local and state news from the Patriot News/ Penn Live. The next two hours the service features a variety of helpful and informative programs including Shopping Guide: pharmacy ads, Senior News, The Travel Hour, Grocery Ads, The Perry County Times newspaper, The Sun newspaper, Harrisburg Magazine, The Paxton Herald, Central Penn Business Journal and more. The final two hours of the six-hour block provides music including Smithsonian Folkways recordings on Tuesdays and Thursdays, special guest interviews and a final hour of Bookworm readings from popular current novels. Each daily six-hour block is repeated throughout a twenty-four-hour cycle.

On the weekend the service continues to provide information and entertainment with programs from the previous week and several selected just for weekend listening pleasure. Please give VROCP Audio Services a listen, sighted or not you may find it interesting and enjoyable. The streaming is made available thanks to dozens of weekly reading volunteers, hundreds of contributions from VROCP donors, grants from organizations like Community Aid, Inc., and local businesses supporting the service with underwriting.

Once signed, applications must be received by the Secretary of the Pennsylvania Counsellors at least two (2) weeks prior to the February State Council meeting.
