Our Immediate Past President Gudrun Yngvadottir helped to launch the New Voices program to help us add more perspectives to our clubs and give women, men, and younger adults an opportunity to have their voice heard. Please help us keep that program growing by including women in our consideration along with men for service within our clubs and communities.

Lions Information Night

Whether it's women, men, older, or younger, this is also a perfect time to plan a Lions Information Night program to fit into your late Winter or early Spring club calendar. We've talked about this in the past as a great way to share what you with your community and hopefully invite some of them to be members.

Here are some ideas for a program:

- 3. Conduct a Member Orientation program. This can help existing members learn while also telling non-members what Lions Clubs all are about.

LCIF EFFORTS IN AUSTRALIA AND PUERTO RICO

In efforts to keep you informed on the ongoing efforts of Lions Clubs International Foundation's response to the wildfires in Australia, LCIF has awarded Australian Lions with US \$143,000. US\$103,000 has been provided to purchase water tanks, which will be used to help combat the fires. In addition, four emergency grants of \$10,000 each have been approved for 4 districts.



In addition, yesterday, Puerto Rico (MD51) has also been hit by a 5.8 magnitude earthquake, followed by a 6.4 magnitude earthquake this morning, damaging homes and business and resulting in widespread power outages across the island. LCIF has been in close contact with our Lions on the ground to provide emergency relief efforts.



Many individuals have asked how they can help. LCIF is currently accepting donations for both disasters as our relief efforts will be ongoing. Our Board of Trustees are meeting this week at headquarters and will be reviewing each of these disasters in detail.
