

HERSHEY LIONS

During its January 2020 meeting, members of the Hershey Lions Club celebrated Citizenship and Patriotism by recognizing members of the community which included first responders and an educator. 2020 marks the 35th year that first responders have been recognized and the 19th year that educators have been recognized.

Peter Sniderman, Firefighter of the Hershey Volunteer Fire Company, Officer Michael L. Henry, Jr. (posthumous) of the Derry Township Police Department, and Emily Gallo, 11th grade English Teacher of the Milton Hershey School, received awards in appreciation of their outstanding and dedicated service to the community. All were selected by their peers to receive these awards.

In a particularly touching tribute, Officer Henry's wife, Jackie Henry and son Zachary attended the event and received the award in his memory. They noted that "Officer Henry's passion was police work and his family." "There was nothing else we would have rather done than support him and the community," added Henry. Officer Henry passed away on January 2, 2020. Several of his fellow officers attended the event as well. In his memory, the Hershey Lions Club gifted a donation to the Derry Township Police Department K9 Unit.

Firefighter Sniderman has served for 3-years with the Hershey Volunteer Fire Company. According to Sniderman, "I don't want a homeowner to be alone on their worst day." "With firefighters there, they are not alone," added Sniderman. Educator Emily Gallo's passion for teaching was very evident. She works with students who are overcoming adversity. Gallo shared "that when asked what my dream job is, I already have it."





GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM MESSAGE

I love My Lions Club!

Doesn't that sound exciting? I hope that we can all say that, although I'm guessing that not all our Lions are quite as enthusiastic as that. I don't mean to be a downer, but we continue to lose more members than we install every year.

Rather than focus on the numbers for now, I'd like to help us focus on ways we can improve our clubs. Even if your club seems to be running smoothly, I'm sure that there are ways that you could improve, either in how you hold your meetings, how your raise money, or how you serve your communities. Fortunately, Lions Clubs International has a straightforward tool to help you look for opportunities to better understand the dynamics of our club and look for specific ways to implement positive change.

I've talked about this before in other postings and in talks on Membership, but I want to remind clubs to consider using the How Are Your Ratings? survey and guide to gain more insight into the workings of your club. You can find this on the LCI website (www.lionsclubs.org) by doing a search for "How Are Your Ratings". This will take you to a page with the following:

- 1. Survey
- 2. Administrative Guidelines
- 3. Results Template

The survey can be conducted rather easily at a club meeting. In my own club, we were able to complete it in about 10 minutes. I highly recommend sending copies, either electronically through email, or through paper mail, to any member who is unable to attend the meeting where you conduct the survey. I suggest that either the Club Membership Chairperson or one of the other club officers conduct the survey and then collect the results. I also recommend that you genuinely assure the members that their responses will be anonymous so as to get honest and helpful responses. Ask the members not to write their names on their survey forms if they want to remain anonymous.

Once all of the survey forms are completed, the Lion conducting the survey will use the instructions in the Administrative Guide to tally the responses in the Results Template. The Results Template is a Microsoft Excel file which automatically arranges the results in an easy way to interpret the results in conjunction with the Administrative Guide. In our club, we learned a lot of things that we already knew, but we did learn a few things that were important to our members and on which we could take some action.

Understanding ourselves better is a key part to our growth, and the growth and change of our individual clubs is important for us to continue to serve our communities in the future. I urge and challenge you to try this if you haven't already done so, or haven't done it in a number of years. I'm more than happy to help you should you have any challenges or questions.

Many of you will be doing "roadside clean-ups," cleaning community parks, sprucing up community flower beds, volunteering at local nursing homes, awarding scholarships – these are ALL various forms of "service" and will be reported as "service" in MyLION.

It's easy to remember - "fundraisers" means the money comes in; "service" means the money goes out.

And, while I'm discussing MyLION. I have been forwarding to our Club Secretaries and Club Service Chairs everything I receive on the updates for MyLION reporting. I have been receiving very good feedback on the improvements. For those who are not reporting your service activities on MyLION, I'd like to encourage you to give it another try.

I will be speaking at the Waynesboro Area Lioness Lions Club on April 1 about MyLION and reporting. I can make myself available in that area earlier in the day. Feel free to contact me.
