A MESSAGE FROM DISTRICT GOVERNOR SAMUEL



Hello,

I hope everyone is in good health. What a month can do to our lives with COVID-19 changing everything we do.

I was exploring how the Lions of our district could help with the COVID-19 problems in our communities. After consulting with Lions and health professionals, I am introducing suggestions

before you as Lions. Here are some ideas and cautions as follows:

1. Check around your community for elderly people who may need help. However, at this time, do not make personal contact with those people. Phone calls only. If someone needs help with groceries or other small deliveries, place the groceries or other items at their door, do not go in the home.
2. If other needs are identified, please assess your personal health exposure before agreeing to perform their request. Remember, wash your hands for 20 seconds after each project.
3. Listed below are the phone numbers for Office of Ageing in our District for you to touch base with:

The above offices are running a skeleton crew and may or may not be able to help.

We are all living through this stressful time – each and every one of us is susceptible to this virus and we all need to take every possible precaution. With our faith, our prayers and our common sense, we will come through this healthier, maybe a little heavier, and hopefully, closer to our loved ones.

Just because we are basically homebound, we can still serve others. We can serve our own club members; we can serve members of our community; and we can serve our family and friends.

◆ Many of you are using this time to do some "spring cleaning." While cleaning out your cupboards, you may find foods that are nearing their expiration date and you know you are not going to use it. Box or bag of non-perishable food. Call your local food pantry. They may welcome a drop-off or a porch pick-up.

◆ While "spring cleaning," you may find some "thinking of you" cards – write a note and send them to friends who are shut in, too. OR send them to local nursing homes – these residents are shut off from the outside world because of the visitation limitations.

◆ Pick up the phone and "phone a friend" – make sure they are okay. Many of our friends live alone and these are particularly lonely times when you combine the "stay at home" orders along with the stress of this medical crisis.

◆ Video chat with family and friends – especially those with children. Not only will you brighten the day of the children, but you will give the parents a break for a few moments. It will also brighten your day to connect with someone outside of your home.

Can you think of other ways we can SERVE others from our homes during this time of stress and the unknown? Send me your ideas so they can be shared with our fellow members.

Until we can meet again, "stay calm, stay home, and stay safe."

GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM MESSAGE

Greetings and Best Wishes to everyone.

If I said that I was writing this message from my recliner, I doubt that anyone would be surprised this month. I'm thinking that you're guessing whether I'm in my pajamas and slippers as well:).

I share this opening because we all need a little levity in the present times as we deal with difficult times. I would also suggest that we need to think about our members, their needs, and what we can do to stay connected with them while we weather the current storm. You may already be thinking of ways to be of service to your communities and how you can help them, but I ask you to look to your members' needs as well.

I ask the leaders of our clubs, possibly in conjunction with your membership chairpersons, to find ways to stay in touch with those in your club. You've probably cancelled your in-person meetings and meals, but there are other options. Consider having a tele-conference or online meeting to keep your members updated. You can use Google to find some free options, but here are two quick options. With Skype (usable on your phone, tablet, or desktop computer), you can host up to 50 people. With Zoom (available on the same devices), you can have a free video conference call for up to 40 minutes. Whatever option you choose, I'd recommend trying the service with just a few people first to be comfortable with how it works prior to getting the whole club involved.

Other ways you might choose to stay connected are continuing to send newsletters, or a simple email message of encouragement. This might also be a good time to look at electronic options for communicating for the future. For instance, if you receive the district newsletter, you've seen email from MailChimp. This service has free options that allow you to manage mailing lists and send nicely formatted messages. In fact, you can even automate annual birthday messages from your club.

If your club isn't as electronically connected (but you have a secretary with a computer), you could also consider sending a postcard to your members without a computer to let them know you're thinking about them.

Beyond staying connected with your members and keeping them up to date, I'd ask you to also consider some of the personal needs of your members. You might have members who have been laid off, or lost health insurance, or otherwise be in difficult situations. Does your club have the ability to help them with their dues temporarily? If you have members for who it is unsafe to venture outside, might you be able to go to the grocery store or pharmacy for them?

We all know that our Lions Clubs are the heart of our international organization. We also know that our members are the heart of our clubs. We will soon be learning more about the North American Membership Initiative (NAMI) and how we can reverse the trend of negative membership growth in the US and Canada. Adding new members to our club is only part of this initiative. As we've discussed in the past, Member Retention is as important or even more important. So please think about your members, how you

LCIF COVID-19 UPDATE

First and foremost, LION Kitty and I hope this finds all Lions, Lionesses & Leos safe and in Good health.

To keep you informed on how LCIF has responded thus far to the COVID-19 crisis, our foundation responded, first in China, and now in Italy, with special designated disaster grants. LCIF awarded a US\$350,000 grant to support local medical and emergency management efforts in Italy due to the extreme scope and scale of the local situation.

LCIF is accepting emergency grant requests for the coronavirus on a case-by-case basis. The application must:

1. Have **at least 100+ people infected (confirmed cases) in the immediate area/district.**
2. Keep to a **US\$10,000 maximum** request amount
3. Funds available only to **address active and immediate cases, not future outbreaks.**
4. Funds should be used for **Lions to work with local medical and emergency management services that are addressing the outbreak.** This could be for sourcing medical supplies, quarantine-related expenses, etc. (i.e. transportation, food) for those infected.
5. Funds **may not cover personal expenses** for those infected or quarantined (i.e. personal bills, medical insurance, lost wages, etc.).

You can find the Emergency Grant application on pages 11-12 of newsletter. You can send the application to lcifemergencygrants@lionsclubs.org. **Please answer the four questions posed in the application.** Especially important is what the Lions plan to purchase, how many people do they hope to target with the project, and how they are working with local medical and emergency services. Please don't hesitate to reach out if you have any questions and I hope you are all safe and healthy.

NORTHEAST PA LIONS SERVICE FOUNDATION

The NEPALSF grants committee has been busy since our last update. Just since January, eight grants have been issued for over \$90,000. District 14U was awarded an \$15,000 grant for the Center for Vision Loss toward replacement of a vehicle to service visually impaired clients, enabling them to get to medical appointments and other essential errands like grocery shopping. Stone Bridge Lions received \$10,000 for a Remote Area Medical (RAM) program that offers medical, vision and dental care via mobile units. The Hershey Lions endorsed a \$10,000 grant to assist Vision Resources of Central Pa in purchasing and installing a freight lift in their facility. A fifty-eight-year-old man was awarded a patient care grant for cataract surgery enabling him to return to work. The Lions Beacon Lodge Camp received over \$30,000 to replace a transport van for blind campers. The NEPALSF is proud to help Lions clubs with worthwhile community project, equipment and patient care service projects such as these. For the current Lions fiscal year, almost \$180,000 in grants have been awarded, keeping us on track for our projected budget for the year.

The partnership with Salus University Department of Blindness and Low Vision Studies will continue to be funded for the upcoming academic year in the amount of \$25,000 and opportunities for Salus student internships and counselor training at Beacon Lodge Camp are also being explored. Automatic entry doors for the Lions State Office have been approved and the project is being managed by state council.

The board would like to acknowledge and thank the Lakemont Lions Club (14L) and Shamokin Area Lions (14G) for their generous donations as well as all Lions who donate through their district governors' projects.

Dear Lion,

The Board of Directors has voted to cancel the 2020 Lions International Convention due to concerns about the coronavirus (COVID-19). This means that the next International Convention will be held in 2021 in Montreal, Canada.

After evaluating a variety of different options including moving the convention to a different venue or postponing the convention to a later date, the Board of Directors voted to cancel the 2020 convention. This decision was made with the health and safety of our Lions, staff and vendors in mind.

Canceling the International Convention for 2020 impacts international officer continuity and candidate elections. After review of the International Constitution and By-Laws, this impact is outlined below:

- Executive officers and international directors will continue in their respective positions until the 2021 convention in Montreal. All candidate elections for these positions shall comply with the provisions of the International Constitution and By-Laws for election at the convention in Montreal.
- An international director from the areas of Africa and Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific is permitted only in even-numbered years. As a result, no director from Africa or Australia, New Zealand, Papua New Guinea, Indonesia and the Islands of the South Pacific would be eligible for election until the 2022 convention.
- Barring any district election complaints, district governors, first vice district governors and second vice district governors elected during a convention of their respective districts will be accepted by Lions International. The International Board of Directors intends to authorize commencement of the DG terms beginning July 1, 2020.

We are disappointed that we will not be able to move forward with this international event, but we are optimistic that with each new day there is hope, and as Lions we will continue to find new ways to put our kindness in action while safely serving our communities.

EMERGENCY GRANT CRITERIA & APPLICATION



**Lions Clubs International
FOUNDATION**

EMERGENCY GRANT PROGRAM OBJECTIVE:

The objective of the Emergency Grant Program is to provide immediate emergency relief assistance to victims of natural disasters through the service work programs of Lions clubs worldwide. Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF) Emergency grants are available for relief aid in the wake of tornadoes, hurricanes, earthquakes, typhoons, monsoons, ice storms, wildfires, flooding caused by excessive rains and similar natural disasters. Emergency grants are not applicable for drought, infestations, disease outbreaks, man-made disasters, political strife or random acts of violence.

APPLICATION AND CRITERIA REQUIREMENTS:

Emergency grants in amounts up to US\$10,000 are available to help Lions districts with the distribution of immediate relief aid to victims of serious natural disasters where 100 or more people have been displaced or affected. The district governor must submit the grant request for an Emergency grant and provide specific details on the damages sustained within their district. Individual clubs may not submit requests for Emergency grants. **LCIF should receive this request from the district governor within 30 days of the disaster's occurrence.** Requests received after this 30-day time period are not eligible for funding. To help meet this 30-day submission deadline, it is recommended that requests be submitted via e-mail, fax or phone.

The Chairperson of the LCIF Board of Trustees has approval authority for Emergency grants for amounts up to US\$10,000. Emergency grant funds are limited to providing immediate needs including the purchase of food, bottled water, clothing, blankets, medicine and cleaning supplies. Emergency grant funds may not be used for non-immediate needs such as providing shelter, rebuilding damaged facilities and homes or replacing household and personal belongings lost as a result of the natural disaster. Please refer to the Emergency Grant Guidelines document available at www.lcif.org for more information on what is considered an immediate need. LCIF Standard grants up to US\$75,000 are available for long-term reconstruction and rehabilitation projects for vital public facilities damaged during a disaster.

EMERGENCY GRANTS CRITERIA:

1. Grant requests will be considered for situations evidenced by an urgent need for water, food, clothing, medical supplies, blankets and cleaning supplies not available from other agencies. The district governor will provide a plan of action for a Lions-led relief effort that involves local Lions in distributing the LCIF-funded relief supplies.
2. An Emergency Grant request from any executive officer of Lions Clubs International shall be given priority based upon his/her personal witness to a natural disaster. Such grants shall be subject to all other Emergency grant criteria.
3. An Emergency grant recipient shall be obligated, as soon as reasonably possible, to supply all information required under the usual grant application process as a condition of acceptance of an Emergency grant.
4. LCIF shall not be a primary relief agency nor shall it seek to duplicate the work of such agencies in their efforts to meet immediate disaster needs, nor attempt to assume responsibilities of governments, insurance carriers or private efforts, except where flagrant and otherwise irremediable omission occur.
5. Emergency grants shall not be given or used to provide direct cash assistance to disaster victims. Numerous other agencies exist principally for that purpose and, in most cases; an Emergency grant is not sufficient to effectively provide for victim's needs.

6. Receipt of an Emergency grant will not necessarily preclude further application being made for matching under the Standard Grant Program for disaster reconstruction projects.
7. Emergency grant recipients are obligated to use grants funds for their original intended purpose within 30 days of receipt of the grants unless given an extension by LCIF. The grant must be used within this time period, immediately after which the district receiving the grant shall send LCIF any unused funds and a detailed grant report of how the funds were expended, along with appropriate receipts and supporting documentation. Outstanding final reports may delay the application process of subsequent requests.

DISASTER DETAILS:

The district governor should answer the following questions in detail. It is important that as much information as possible is provided about the damages sustained within the district. A delay in providing this information will delay processing of the Emergency grant request.

1. When and where did the disaster occur? (Specify cities, counties, villages, etc.)
2. What is the extent of the damage, deaths and injuries? How many homes and families were affected?
3. What current relief efforts are underway by the community, relief agencies and Lions?
4. What is the district's plan of action to purchase and distribute immediate relief aid such as food, clothing, blankets, bottled water, medical supplies and similar items with the LCIF Emergency grant funds?

When all information is received by LCIF from the district governor and if it meets the Emergency grant criteria, the request is presented to the LCIF Chairperson for consideration. Emergency grants are issued upon the approval of the Foundation's Chairperson within the guidelines of the grant criteria. LCIF will not reimburse Lions for money spent on relief efforts executed prior to grant approval.

CERTIFICATION BY DISTRICT GOVERNOR:

This is to certify that I have reviewed the LCIF Emergency Grant Criteria. I endorse the need for an Emergency grant and will do everything in my power to assure proper and efficient administration of the Emergency grant funds to purchase and distribute only food, clothing, blankets, bottled water, cleaning supplies, medical supplies and similar items through a Lions relief program.

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE TO ARTICLE VII, SECTION 4, COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON.

THE RESOLUTION ADDS LANGUAGE TO CLARIFY: 1) THE TERM OF OFFICE FOR THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON; 2) THE SELECTION PROCESS FOR APPOINTING A REPLACEMENT IN THE EVENT OF A VACANCY IN THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON POSITION; AND 3) THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON ROTATION.

BE IT RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 2020, Article VII, Section 4, will read as follows:

“Section 4: COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON. The Chairperson of the State Council shall be the Immediate Past District Governor who had served in the capacity of Vice-Chairperson during the preceding year, who for the year 2020-2021 shall be from Sub-District P. The Council Chairperson shall serve for a one-year term only and cannot serve in that capacity again.

In the event, either before or after becoming the Chairperson, if unable or refuses to serve, or having accepted, resigns or dies, then the District Governor of that sub-district shall appoint a Past-District Governor who is resident in and a member in good standing of a Lions Club in that sub-district to serve out the term of office. If no Past District Governor from the sub-district is willing to serve, then the sitting Council of Governors will appoint a Past District Governor from the two preceding State Councils who is a resident in and member in good standing of a Lions Club in Pennsylvania to serve the remaining term of office. The normal Council Chairperson rotation will resume when the replacement Council Chairperson's term of office is completed.

- REPLACES THE "PENNSYLVANIA NEWS PUBLICATION FUND" WITH THE "COMMUNICATION/WEB/PRIDE FUND" AND REDUCES THE ALLOCATION FROM \$1.50 TO \$0.25
