
LCIF CHAIRMAN MESSAGE

GLOBAL MEMBERSHIP TEAM & NAMI MESSAGE

Have 3 years gone by that fast?

As I completed my District Governor year in June 2017, I shifted to my role as Global Membership Team (GMT) Coordinator. It has been my honor to try to serve District 14-T in that capacity since then. I want to thank all our clubs for being open to assistance and guidance, and for continuing to pay attention to strength and growth in membership.

While I will no longer be the GMT Coordinator for the 2020-2021 Lions Year, I will be taking on a new role of North American Membership Initiative (NAMI) Champion for our district. In this regard, I will be cheerleading, educating, and reporting regarding this new initiative along with our district leadership and our clubs. But what is NAMI and why are we pursuing it?

Let us start with the why. Since 1980, membership in Lions Clubs in the US (Constitutional Area 1) has fallen from over 500,000 members to barely 300,000. We have not had one year in that timeframe where we've had an increase in membership in the US (Canada has seen a similar decline). The US is where Lions Clubs was formed, and the needs of our communities continue to grow. Only with focus and determination can we break this trend for the future of our clubs and those for whom we provide service.

To get additional details on NAMI, you can visit the LCI resources at <u>www.lionsclubs.org/nami</u>. You'll find information on the areas of focus and process framework. You'll see that we're planning to use many of the tools we already have but will be putting our clubs and districts at the heart of our grass roots efforts. We'll also be enhancing our processes, sharing lessons learned across the district and state and beyond, and drawing from the knowledge of our clubs.

Areas of Focus

1. *Rejuvenate Districts with New Clubs* - building on recent successes, we will look for new opportunities for new clubs including club branches, specialty clubs, and possible cyber clubs in under-served areas within our district.

2. *Rejuvenate Clubs with New Members* - with assistance and involvement from our clubs, we will look to develop the future of our clubs with new members, especially for clubs who are most in need.

3. *Re-Motivate Members with New Fellowships and Exciting Service* - to continue to provide value to our members and ensure a positive experience, we will work with clubs to explore new ideas from our members, improve our service, and in turn improve our retention.

4. *Support District and Club Leaders* - since we need the combined assistance of our district and club leaders to effect this change, we will also be giving more attention to the developmental needs of our leaders through training, mentoring, and leadership events.

Process

1. Build a Team - District Governor-Elect Cathy Baker has already begun planning to develop our district-wide leadership team to support the areas of focus above. Each area will have a team leader and team members. If you are asked to assist, we ask you to thoughtfully consider how you can help.

 Build a Vision - Using the LCI SWOT (Strengths, Weaknesses, Opportunities, Threats) Analysis framework, our teams and leaders will discuss where we are as a district and develop a vision and goals for positive change.
 Build a Plan - Also using the LCI framework, we will create a step by step plan to meet our goals and achieve our vision.
 Build Success - Here is where the "rubber meets the road" and we take the concrete steps to develop new clubs, attract new members, enhance our member experience, and support our leaders. We will also be communicating regularly and reporting on progress to our clubs, district, state, and LCI.

Join Me

Our District of 14-T has already opted in for this ongoing journey after some early successes have been realized by pilot districts within the US. We all need to commit to our roles whether it's inviting friends to learn more about this or sparking new clubs in new communities. You will be seeing more communications, but won't you join me in making a difference as Lions? If so, can I hear you ROAR?

Again, I thank you for your support in my role as GMT Coordinator, and look forward to partnering with you and your clubs as we collectively grow and improve membership within North America.
