I hope this finds everyone safe, healthy, and getting back to sub normal distancing.

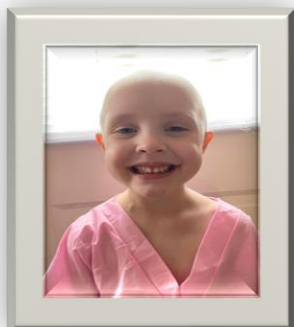

Four area food banks each received \$400 from Greencastle-Antrim Lioness Club.

Because of extra needs resulting from the COVID-19 pandemic, the club's board of directors recently voted to give a total of \$1,600 to: Greencastle-Antrim Food Pantry (housed in Greencastle Presbyterian Church); Antrim Brethren in Christ Church; Greencastle Evangelical Lutheran Church; and The Storehouse Community Church.

Also, the annual Lioness luxury purse and cash bingo will not be conducted in September. However, it might be conducted later or be replaced by another fundraiser yet to be determined. The club made \$441 at its March 14 bake sale/\$1 items at the Lions Club pancake breakfast in Greencastle-Antrim Middle School.

Money raised is returned to the community in various ways.

May, June Activities-As everyone else, we in Mifflintown Lions are having trouble serving our community due to Covid-19.



We did get together once before Memorial Day and once after to work on the traffic circle in Mifflintown at the intersection of Rt. 35 and old Rt. 22. The first meeting we weeded, tilled, and planted some new shrubs. The second day

Our business meeting followed with financial reports given by our two treasurers and we found we were solvent with some surplus. We voted to give a \$1000 donation to the Juniata County Library, and an additional \$650 to go along with the \$4500 budgeted to Central Juniata Park Pool in Mifflin.

Two certificates were presented. The first was a Diamond Centennial Membership letter and pin to Lion Tom Wert and the second to Larry Booker for sponsoring Bob Graybill as a new member.

Highway clean-up will take place after the state mows the berm along Cedar Spring Road.

Lion Sam Leister reported on the awarding of two new Lloyd Showers Scholarships to Erin Crimmel(Juniata HS) and Paige Smith(East Juniata HS). These \$500 Scholarships go to a student that will be attending either Millersville or Shippensburg Universities after they have successfully completed their Freshman year. Last year's 2019 recipient, Gregory Niebert was also awarded his \$500.

We had a very enjoyable evening sitting in the forest and meeting and socializing for the first time since March.

Under normal circumstances, the Lions of PA Foundation Board meets four times a year. Due to COVID19, our meeting discussions have been carried out through emails. But rest assured, the Foundation continues to provide grants to our Clubs to improve services to your communities.

The Foundation provides an average of \$25,000 in grants every quarter for approximately \$100,000 each year. Grants are considered for Districts and Clubs. The Grant Application can be found on the LOPF website: lionsofpafoundation.org

The Foundation raises funds for Grants through donations made by our Clubs to the District Projects which in-turn is sent to the Foundation at the end of the Lions Year. At the end of 2019-2020, 14-T presented the Foundation with \$6,000.

Grant funds are also raised when our Clubs and District honor our members with a Lions of PA Fellow, a Progressive Fellow or a Past International President Joseph L. Wroblewski Award. Applications for these awards can also be found on the LOPF website: lionsofpafoundation.org

The Landisburg Lions Club, home of District Governor Sam Wagner, recently welcomed him on his final stop of official visits.

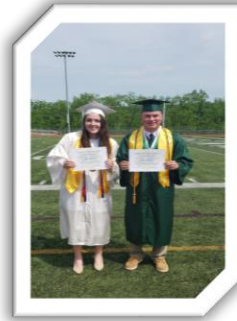

At GAHS, Meyers was a member of National Honor Society, for which she was secretary; Spanish National Honor Society; and Big Buddies. For four years, she played field hockey, and in winters she enjoys snowboarding.

MT PARNELL LIONS

The Mt. Parnell Lions Club of St. Thomas, PA has not had any regular meetings through the months of April, May, and June due to safety concerns with the Coronavirus pandemic. However, the Club investigated and found that the St. Thomas Food Bank was in dire need of additional funding to purchase food and supplies for their ever-increasing requests for aid from the community. Many families have been without adequate food and basic supplies. Therefore, the Mt. Parnell Lions began a program of identifying needs and supplying financial resources to meet those needs. Through the generosity of the Club, the Club members, and families and from friends of the Lions Club, more than \$7,500.00 was raised and sent to the Food Bank. We especially thank the St. Thomas American Legion, the St. Thomas Sportsmen Association, and more than 60 individuals and families for their cooperative help with this project. In addition to the financial resources obtained and donated we were able to have hundreds of dozens of eggs donated to the clients of the Food Bank. The Director of the Food Bank has said that the Mt. Parnell Lions Club has been an absolute blessing to the program. This project helped the Lions Club to "give back" directly to a great community that has supported us throughout the years.

"GOOD THINGS HAPPEN"



One of the things we encourage our year-round staff to do at PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp is to become certified to operate the climbing tower and zip line. This provides our seasonal staffers, who have less experience, with support they can call on until they become comfortable in their roles as operators. It also means our Camp Coordinator has more flexibility in planning activities, knowing he can rely on more than only the counseling staff if counselors are needed for other activities during the same time. That is how I ended up at the top of the zip line, loading campers and sending them to the bottom.

We had very good participation that day, with lots of Children's Village campers eagerly waiting in line to experience the ride on our 700 feet long, 65 feet high zip line. Many rode two or three times. Throughout the activity I kept seeing one little girl in particular who had Down syndrome. She hadn't left the benches where the Children's Village Unit Director was helping the kids get into their harnesses and helmets. I saw her shake her head vigorously "no" when she was offered a harness. Toward the end of the activity period she came down, carefully, to the fence to watch others take the ride. When she noticed me looking at her, she ran back to the benches and sat looking the other way. The CV Unit Director was seeing this as well, and kept offering the little girl a harness, which she eventually accepted. She made her way to the platform three times, each time running back to the benches and starting to take the harness off. Through encouragement, the Unit Director would help this little girl get her courage back up, and she would try again. The fourth time she came down, she got as far as putting one foot on the platform when she started to cry. She yelled at me, "I don't want to do this!" I told her she didn't have to. She stood there with tears streaming down her face, looking at the cable, the platform, the landing area so far away. She asked to see the trolley. She asked what the "clippy thing" was called. I started talking to her about wanting to do something, but being scared to try. Eventually, through her questions and my demonstrations of how the equipment works together to keep a rider safe, she was connected to the zip line, safety checks done, and the workers at the bottom were ready to assist at the end of the ride. I asked if she was sure she didn't want to ride. She looked at me nervously, beginning to cry again. I told her it was ok if she didn't want to ride, but she'd be happy with herself if she did, and that

everything was ready if she decided to ride. Through her tears, she smiled up at me and said, "You sound like my Dad." Then she turned and took a brave step off the platform to have the ride of her life. She decided to step out of her comfort zone into growth. From 700 feet away I could hear her yelling, "I did it!"

If your club has ever sent a camper sponsorship, you made this happen. If you have ever joined the 500 Club, you made this happen. If you have ever come to help at a work weekend, you made this happen. That important moment in that little girl's life would not have happened without you, a Pennsylvania Lion. This is only one of the stories from a place that has been doing this for 73 years; only one of the triumphs out of hundreds of campers at PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp, and you make this happen.

Beacon Lodge is a state project of the Lions of Pennsylvania. By being a Pennsylvania Lion, you are making this possible for all our campers. You are giving them the opportunity to take a vacation, learn to make new friends, grow as individuals and get a sense of control over what they do. Next time you have the opportunity, please come visit the place where good things happen. What an incredible thing we, as Lions of Pennsylvania, have built.

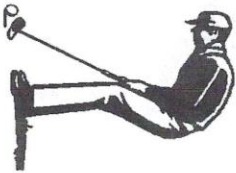
