GLOBAL SERVICE TEAM MESSAGE

As we gain a bit more freedom from months of isolation, we are starting to move cautiously into more and more activities. Our clubs are starting to meet again – some in-person and some virtually. Clubs are again holding fundraisers – I'm hearing about drive-thru events and I've even seen "live drawings" on social media. Continue to think outside the box! There are many ways to SERVE while remaining safe and maintaining "social distancing."

In last month's message my statistics were based on Clubs reporting within the last 6 months. Since I BELIEVE we can reach my goals by June 30, 2021 and we are now into our fourth month if this Lions Year, I will base numbers using 2020-2021 figures.

Each month our numbers continue to improve and as of my last edit of this article:

- 2 clubs have not reported their current officer to LCI.
- 9 clubs have not submitted a membership reported in 2020-2021
- 16 clubs have not reported any activity in 2020-2021

Current Statistics for District 14-T from MyLION of "reported" activities since July 1:

- 25,901 People served
- 160 Activities
- 2,919 Volunteered Hours
- \$13,432 Raised
- \$27,588 Donated

NOTE: There are at least 5 clubs that have "past activities" listed on MyLION, but the "reports" have not been completed. After your activity, go back into MyLION. Go to the activity and click "edit" to enter the results. Then be sure to click "REPORT." Only then will your figures be entered. If your activity was not listed prior to the event, be sure to "REPORT PAST ACTIVITY" — whether it's a meeting, service activity, fundraiser or donation.

Did you know that each and every one of our members can go into the MyLION and see not only what your club is doing, but you can also see what clubs in District 14-T, clubs in our Multiple District 14 and clubs in the US and clubs around the world are doing!

Simply go onto the Lions Club website (<u>www.lionsclubs.org</u>). If you are not already "registered", click MEMBER LOGIN, then click REGISTER and complete the questions. If you need any assistance, you can contact me or your Club Secretary.

LCI is putting out a **SERVICE REPORTING CHALLENGE** for Lions Year – July 1, 2020 through June 30, 2021. This "challenge" is for monthly club reports to be completed.

District Service Coordinators whose districts finish in the top 10 of our Constitutional Area (CA1: United States and the islands of the Caribbean), based on the highest percentage of clubs reporting service through MyLION are eligible. "Hey now – wouldn't you like to see our District Service Coordinator (D-GST) receive that award!!"

But that's not all – Club Service Chairs and Leo Club Presidents whose clubs finish among the top 20 clubs in CA1 with the highest number of service projects reported through MyLION are eligible for a Leadership Award – last year's winners were just announced and a Lion from 14-P was among the top 20! If your club has not selected a Club Service Chair, please list the Club Secretary for this position on your "officers list" at LCI.

As I have mentioned before, please feel free to contact me at any time. I will be only too happy to complete your Membership and/or Activity Reports to get you and your club started in this Lions Year. You will find with some coaching, you will become very familiar and at ease using the new reporting system. I will make myself available to any member to assist listing or reporting an activity.

Strengths

As a reminder, strengths are internal and we can look to them to identify what we already have to support us in moving forward. Here are some questions that can be asked to help identify strengths:

1. What do we do well?

- 2. What knowledge, skills, or experience do we have?
- 3. How do others view our strengths?

Weaknesses

Weaknesses are also internal, and they are challenges that we might encounter as we move forward on our path. Some questions to help us identify weaknesses:

- 1. What are our challenges?
- 2. What knowledge, skills, or experience do we lack?
- 3. How do others view our weaknesses?

Opportunities

Similar to strengths, but differing in that they are from external factors, we can recognize opportunities that might support us on our journey. Questions that can help us identify such opportunities are:

- 1. What opportunities exist in the area where we are or will be working?
- 2. How can others' strengths support achievement?
- 3. How can others help us convert our weaknesses into strengths?

Threats

These are external factors that are beyond our control that can hinder our ability to pursue success. A few questions to help us identify threats:

- 1. What threats exist within the area where we are or will be working?
- 2. Are there other people or organizations in the same area that are competing with us for the same resources (or people)?
- 3. What structural changes (economic, legal, policy, or other external factor) could have a negative impact on our work? Another update will be coming next month. I'll also be reaching out to our clubs and zone chairs in the near future to offer overviews of the NAMI initiative and process. I'm also available to attend zone and club meetings to present on this important topic.



Lions: Please remember that all Lions clubs, districts and multiple districts that have annual gross receipts of less than US\$50,000 and do not have to file Forms 990 or 990-EZ must file the e-Postcard (also known as 990-N). If your Lions club, district or multiple district has a foundation, which is a separate legal entity, the appropriate form will need to be filed as well.

All filers must register at IRS.gov prior to filing their next Form 990-N. This is a one-time registration if the designated Lion files annually. If the designee changes from a prior year, the new designee must register with the IRS.

Please refer to the following chart regarding annual filing requirements:

2019-2020 Tax Year*	Form to File
Gross receipts normally \$50,000 or less	990-N
Gross receipts greater than \$50,000 and less than \$200,000, and total assets less than \$500,000	990-EZ or 990
Gross receipts \$200,000 or greater or total assets \$500,000 or greater	990

The e-Postcard is due by the 15th day of the fifth month after the close of your tax year. Lions clubs operate on a fiscal year, July 1-June 30, and the e-Postcard is due by November 15 each year. Please note that an organization cannot request an extension for filing the Form 990-N.

If you do not file, you risk losing your tax-exempt status. Any Lions club that fails to meet its annual reporting requirement for three consecutive years will automatically lose its tax exempt status. A club may <u>apply</u> for reinstatement of its tax exemption even if it originally fell under a group exemption.

Every club and/or district (single, sub- and multiple) must have an employer identification number (EIN), even if it will not have employees. The EIN is a unique number that identifies the organization to the Internal Revenue Service. To apply for an EIN, you should obtain a Form SS-4 and its instructions from the IRS. You may also apply for an EIN online, by telephone (1-800-829-4933) or by fax (fax number at the location accepting applications from your state). It is important that clubs and districts use the correct EIN for their annual filing.

PA State Council of Lions Clubs Special Election.

Date: September 28, 2020

The Special Election, due at the November State Council Meeting on November 6 thru 8, 2020 will still take place.

The necessity of this Special Election is to complete the two outstanding Ballot Questions, originally scheduled for a vote at the May 2020 State Convention.

The Council of Governors, at a Zoom Meeting on Sunday, September 20th approved the Multiple District hold an Electronic Election and selected Election Runner as the application of choice.

This letter will now serve as the official notice of the manner and timing of an Electronic Special Election, using electionrunner.com to be conducted by the MD14 Lions of Pennsylvania on Sunday, November 8, 2020 – between the hours of 12 noon and 8pm.

An election packet will be mailed to each District Governor in time for inclusion in their Newsletters and for distribution by their District Secretary/Certification Chair to Club Presidents and Secretaries containing the following documentation to guide them through the process:

- Election Process sets forth the steps and timing of the election to ensure its successful completion.
- Delegate-Collection Spreadsheet an excel spreadsheet to enter the Delegate names, member numbers (for certification purposes only) and email addresses to be uploaded to electionrunner.com.
- Official Delegate Certification Form each Club Secretary and/or President
 must complete and return this and the Delegate Collection Spreadsheet to the
 State Office, preferably by email, by <u>Friday October 23, 2020</u>.
- Sample Letter to Clubs including the Potential Delegate Count showing simplified process and the number of delegates that each club in each District is entitled to.
- Ballot Questions copies of the two Ballot Questions.
- Unpaid Dues Schedule Dues must be paid to Lions Clubs International no later than <u>Monday October 14, 2020</u> for a club to be entitled to have their nominated delegates to vote in this election. (Each District receives their own District Recap Report to be included in this packet).

It is very important that all delegates have a correct email address as the election will be conducted electronically (no paper ballots will be sent.)

It is especially important that the timeframes set forth in the Election Process document are adhered to for the election to be completed and it is imperative that Clubs notify their delegates of this process, so they know what to expect.

Once all delegates have been certified by the Districts and sent to the State Office, 17 sub elections will be set up and delegate information uploaded into electionrunner.com.

On **Sunday, November 8**, **2020** an Invitation to Vote will be issued to every certified delegate from **electionrunner.com** and will contain:

- · a link to access the system to record your vote
- a Unique Voter ID and Voter Key. The use of these ensures the ballots remain secret.

Voting must be completed no later than Sunday November 8, 2020 at 8pm.

Ballot Question 1

THE FOLLOWING RESOLUTION CONCERNS AMENDING THE INTERNATIONAL ASSOCIATION OF LIONS CLUBS MULTIPLE DISTRICT-14 (PENNSYLVANIA) CONSTITUTION. TO BE ADOPTED, THIS AMENDMENT TO THE CONSTITUTION REQUIRES AN AFFIRMATIVE VOTE OF TWO-THIRDS (2/3) OF THE CERTIFIED DELEGATES CASTING A VOTE.

A RESOLUTION TO PROVIDE ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE TO ARTICLE VII, SECTION 4, COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON.

THE RESOLUTION ADDS LANGUAGE TO CLARIFY: 1) THE TERM OF OFFICE FOR THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON; 2) THE SELECTION PROCESS FOR APPOINTING A REPLACEMENT IN THE EVENT OF A VACANCY IN THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON POSITION; AND 3) THE COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON ROTATION.

BE IT RESOLVED, that effective July 1, 2021, Article VII, Section 4, will read as follows:

"Section 4: COUNCIL CHAIRPERSON. The Chairperson of the State Council shall be the Immediate Past District Governor who had served in the capacity of Vice-Chairperson during the preceding year, who for the year 2020-2021 shall be from Sub-District P. The Council Chairperson shall serve for a one-year term only and cannot serve in that capacity again.

In the event, either before or after becoming the Chairperson, if unable or refuses to serve, or having accepted, resigns or dies, then the District Governor of that sub-district shall appoint a Past-District Governor who is resident in and a member in good standing of a Lions Club in that sub-district to serve out the term of office. If no Past District Governor from the sub-district is willing to serve, then the sitting Council of Governors will appoint a Past District Governor from the two preceding State Councils who is a resident in and member in good standing of a Lions Club in Pennsylvania to serve the remaining term of office. The normal Council Chairperson rotation will resume when the replacement Council Chairperson's term of office is completed.

- ELIMINATES THE "PROMOTION FUND" OF \$0.35
- INCREASES THE "STATE COUNCIL ADMINISTRATIVE FUND" FROM \$8.50 TO \$9.60
- INCREASES THE "SUB-DISTRICT ADMINISTRATIVE FUND" FROM \$2.50 TO \$3.00
- REPLACES THE "PENNSYLVANIA NEWS PUBLICATION FUND" WITH THE "COMMUNICATION/WEB/PRIDE FUND" AND REDUCES THE ALLOCATION FROM \$1.50 TO \$0.25

THE RESOLUTION **DOES NOT** INCREASE OR DECREASE THE CURRENT OVERALL DUES
