THE FEDERATED WOMEN'S CLUB OF HERSHEY PARTNERS WITH THE HERSHEY LIONS CLUB TO IMPROVE VISION



Derry Township, PA -- The Federated Women's Club of Hershey recently partnered with the Hershey Lions Club to heighten awareness about vision impairment and collect used eyeglasses. The joint effort began with a recent \$250 contribution by the Federated Women's Club of Hershey to the Hershey Lions Club to help the visually impaired.

"The 2-year project started with information from the National Eye Institute that by the year 2050, the four most common eye problems will or will nearly double. It is important that we learn about the detection and treatment of these diseases," reported Carol Foley, local and state project chair and member of the Federated Women's Club of Hershey. "Helping people who are blind or visually impaired to live the most fulfilling lives they can is valuable to those people and to their communities," shared Foley. Why partner with the Hershey Lions Club? "Once I

learned the Vision Impairment Awareness project was chosen by our state president, I immediately thought about teaming up with the Hershey Lions Club to help support their projects," added Foley.

"We're delighted to affiliate with the Federated Women's Club of Hershey to benefit the community. Partnering to help the visually impaired is a meaningful way to expand the service impact of both organizations," added Hershey Lions Club President, Steve Gallerizzo. The \$250 donation from the Federated Women's Club of Hershey was quickly used to help an uninsured resident obtain an eye exam and eyeglasses. The Hershey Lions have been helping the visually impaired since the club's founding in 1944 with eye exams and glasses and used eyeglass collections. Used eyeglasses are collected to be matched up with needy people around the world. Hershey Lions have also provided camp sponsorships for the visually impaired, and large print books for the Hershey Library, among other efforts.

Federated Women's Clubs across the state, which fall under the General Federation of Women's Clubs Pennsylvania (GFWC Pennsylvania), are also partnering with other Lions Clubs and other organizations in similar ways. Collectively, the Federated Women's Clubs have a goal of gathering over 2,020 pairs of used eyeglasses for donation by May of 2022. Federated Women's Clubs swiftly exceeded their goal with the most recent total of 2,045 used eyeglasses collected. The "Vision Impairment Awareness" project is 2020-2022 GFWC Pennsylvania President Sandy Hauenstein's State President's project. Hauenstein also volunteers at Vision Resources of Central PA and hosts a two hour weekly live radio broadcast including current weather, news, opinion pieces, and interesting articles broadcast on line and available to the vision impaired.

LANDISBURG LIONS





For more than 25 years Super Bowl Sunday has been chicken barbeque day for the Landisburg Lions Club. The effort begins the week before collecting supplies and members gather to load the first seven racks of birds Saturday morning to store in the fire company's walk-in cooler. By 4AM the morning of the big game the "Pit Crew" has reported for duty preparing the pit and touching off the fire no later than 4:15. Within fifteen minutes (depending on weather conditions!) optimum temperature has been reached and the cooking begins, as does the annual debate of "are they ready to be turned?" (traditional wisdom is they are are ALWAYS ready to be turned). Meanwhile the Sauce Master and his assistant, the designated Sprayer, have been conjuring the mythical and magical brew that is liberally applied over the birds as they sizzle and crisp. It's a good year weather-wise when the nozzle of the sprayer doesn't have to be kept near the pit to prevent freezing!

Now there was a time when after about ninety minutes of local news and sports chatter, tall tales, and outright lies the real debate would erupt-- is a rack done? This was, at one time, determined by the twisting of the leg portion of the quarter. If it was "tight", cook on. If "loose", take off the rack. This would lead to controversies and accusations of "leg snapping" by impatient Lions. However in the last decade the meat thermometer with its 185-190 degrees under the wing goal has been introduced and made the historic "bones of contention" moot. As the racks come off the chicken is placed in foil lined coolers and another 40 birds are readied for cooking. In a normal year a second round of six racks are needed to cook the 500 halves; but in this year of Co-Vid and a predicted snowstorm only 400 quarters were prepared. By the time (8-9 AM) the second set of racks are completed the "Sellers/ distributors" have reported for duty as many of the Pit Crew head home. This year the club set up drive-thru pick up lanes at two locations.

Officially sales are from 9 am until noon or sold out; but typically, as occurred this year, a passing pedestrian made the first purchase of three quarters at 7:30AM. BBQ Committee chair Michael Lyons reported that despite the impact of Co-vid the last sale was at 11AM. His thanks to all the Landisburg Lions who helped with this year's Super Bowl Sunday BBQ.

March 2021 will mark the 100th anniversary for one of Central Pennsylvania's most vital non-profit, community benefit organizations: Vision Resources of Central Pennsylvania (VROCP). The agency began as a member agency of the Pennsylvania Association for the Blind (PAB) for Dauphin County and the programs and services of VROCP have grown to include Cumberland, Perry and Franklin counties.

A growing, elderly population in Pennsylvania and across the nation has experienced increases of individuals affected by the four major eye diseases: Macular Degeneration, Diabetic Retinopathy, Cataract, and Glaucoma. In turn there will be greater needs for prevention and education programs, employment for individuals with disabilities, and case coordinators providing support and social services to fulfill the VROCP mission to *facilitate independence*, *enrich the quality of life*, and empower individuals who are visually impaired or otherwise disabled through prevention, employment and educational awareness programs.

Vision Resources appreciates all that the Lions have done to support the agency's mission to the blind and visually impaired. VROCP would be interested in District 14-T joining in celebration for the organization's 100th anniversary and forging a *New Century of Service* to the region.
