NORTHEAST PA LIONS SERVICE FOUNDATION

Since our last report in November, the Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation has been hard at work accepting grant applications, improving our operations and even expanding our board of directors.

Recent grants awarded include facility improvements at Camp Victory (District 14G), a mobile playroom for Wellspan York Hospital (District 14C), equipment grants for vision screeners for Districts 14D and G, community project grants for Mansfield Veterans Park (District 14G) and the Center for Vision Loss in District 14K as well as a patient care grant for cataract surgery in District 14C.

Our relationship with Salus University Department of Blindness and Low Vision continues in 2021 with a \$25,000 award for scholarships and an additional \$5000 to replace training equipment.

The foundation by laws have been amended to allow an additional board representative from each of our nine Lions district service area, expanding our board of directors from eighteen voting members to twenty-seven. A policy and procedures manual has been developed to aid with board member orientation and development.

We request club or district meeting minutes be included with grant applications which document that a vote was taken to endorse the grant request. Please visit www.nepalsf.org to access application guidelines under the GRANTS tab. If you have any questions or need assistance, please reach out to your district's board members or to grants@nepalsf.org.

Sadly, we mourn the loss of another charter board member, PDG Jack Smith, whose energy, sense of humor and collaboration was invaluable to the NEPALSF.

Important Convention News for all Lions, Lioness and LEO clubs of District 14T

With the ongoing restrictions on public gatherings imposed by the state, as well as health and welfare of our members, the April 24, 2021 District Convention will not be held in person. However, unlike last year we plan to have a modified version of our convention virtually via *Zoom* on April 24, 2021.

Delegate voting will again be done virtually for our 2021-2022 district leadership as well as changes to the District Constitution & By Laws and a Convention Committee Representative from Region 4.

Candidates – By <u>April 10, 2021,</u> any candidate for any of the three offices for 2021-2022 District Leadership must submit the required paperwork and qualifications to the Convention Chairperson PDG Pete Van Zandt and the Nominating Committee of PDGs Grady McMullen, Robert Roebuck and Keldeen Stambaugh.

Delegates — By April 16, 2021, each Lions Club is asked to send an email message with the names and email addresses of club members in good standing who will serve as delegates for your club to District Governor Cathy Baker (lioncathybaker@gmail.com) and Cabinet Secretary Barbara Dudek (templegymm@yahoo.com). Each Lions club is entitled to one delegate for every ten members or majority portion thereof based on your club's total membership as of December 31, 2020. PDGs will all receive the ballot link via the existing PDG mail group.

Voting — **On** <u>April 19, 2021</u>, a link to an electronic ballot, instructions and candidate qualifications will be sent to the delegate email addresses provided by each Lions Club and to the PDG mail group. <u>Voting will be "open" for 10 hours April 24, 2021 between 2:00 pm and 11:59 pm.</u> The votes cast will be compared with the number of identified delegates to ensure accuracy. The identity of voters will not be publically disclosed. The Elections Committee will issue a final elections report by April 26, 2021.

We appreciate your understanding in this modified elections process. We are still required to following election guidelines from Lions Clubs International and hope this process will make it as easy as possible to complete this activity.

A member of the Chilliwack Mount Cheam Lions Club since 1988, he first became a Lion in 1979 as part of the Sandspit Lions Club.


