#### MESSAGE FROM 1VDG DENNIS


Greetings Lions, Lioness and Leos,

I hope you are all well and safe. I am excited to see that most of our clubs have been able to reinstate service projects and fund raising. Fairs and festivals in most communities have restarted after having to take 2020 off. I am always humbled by all of you working so hard to help your communities. During July, I had the opportunity to spend 2 days at Beacon Lodge. I'd been a Lion for 37 years and never made it up there before. The fact is that what started out as a camp for sight impaired people has expanded to include special needs camps and Project New Hope that provides a camping experience to veterans injured while in the service of our country and their families. There are facilities to house adult campers as well as 12 cabins that can accommodate 4 people at a time. Recreation activities include a zip line and a rock climbing wall. However, with cuts in state funding, Beacon Lodge has had to rely on its investments and at the current rate of spending may be forced to close in about 14 years from today unless additional financial support is obtained.

Most clubs in District 14-T know the importance of Beacon Lodge since our clubs traditionally donate more to the Lodge than any of the 15 other District Governor projects.

I am looking forward to visiting clubs starting in August with our DG Peggy. Please be safe as we Serve together!



"The high point of the season was watching the players progress with their ball skills. Players advanced from hitting from the "T" to coach pitch and all players got a hit. It was exciting to see the players develop an understanding of the position they played and the follow through for their position when a hit came to them. It was also inspiring to see players build trust among each other on the field," shared coach Leshko. The Hershey Lions ball team had 10-players on the roster this year and was scheduled to play 15-regular season games.

According to its website, www.hersheylittleleague.net, the Hershey Little League offers instructional and competitive baseball programs for Derry Township and local youth between the ages of 4 years to 19 years. Their primary goal is the molding of future citizens while promoting the ideals of good sportsmanship, honesty, loyalty, courage, and respect for authority, while having fun.

The Hershey Lions Club has historically sponsored youth sports. ## MIFFLIN-MIFFLINTOWN LIONS CLUB

Mifflin-Mifflintown Lions celebrated their 75<sup>th</sup> Anniversary at Annsfield Estate on June 21st. The club was officially chartered on May 24. 1946, with 36 members. The first meeting place was Bratton's Restaurant in Mifflin, followed by Zimmie's Diner from late 70's until another move was made to Stop 35 in 1991. They met there until 2019 when they made the move to their present location at Messiah Lutheran Church where they receive catered meals. The club has been honored to have 5 Melvin Jones Fellowship Awards given to Warren "Doc" Stump, Harry "Preach "Fairman, R. Brad Brown, John Groninger, and Warren "Red" Mummah who has also received the Carl Shoemaker Award. Red is still an active member and in November will mark 65 years of service.

The club holds 2 fund raising activities during the year, typically selling 1300-1500 halves of chicken in each. In the spring of 2020 the BBQ was cancelled due to Covid-19 so the members just made donations totaling over \$5000 for the Central Juniata Park Pool which normally receives \$4500 each spring. 

## **CAMP FIRE CHILI**

2-3 cloves garlic-minced

2-16 oz. cans diced tomatoes or stewed tomatoes
