DISTRICT 14-T POLICY AND GUIDELINES FOR THE NORTHEAST PENNSYLVANIA LIONS SERVICE FOUNDATION

(Formerly Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Eye Bank)

PURPOSE

To end eyesight and hearing impairment through education, grants and partnerships within our communities, to help actively and effectively support the impaired in our society and to help Lions clubs meet the needs of our 37-county service area. Grants and financial support to individuals in need or to organizations will be in four categories; patient care, education, equipment needs or community projects.

GENERAL

- 1. District 14-T will be represented by two board members. Board members may be recommended by the District Governor or recruited and approved by other Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Service Foundation board members.
- 2. All monies received for the project from District 14-T Lions and Leo clubs or from any other source shall be immediately delivered to the district treasurer for recording purposes. No monies appropriated as funds for the Northeast Pennsylvania Lions Service Foundation may be spent for any other purpose.
- 3. Representative district board members shall be available to present programs to Lions and Leo clubs or other interested parties. No compensation can be received, however contributions to the project can be accepted.
- 4. District 14-T representatives shall be available to make a report at District 14T cabinet meetings as requested by the District Governor and to keep membership informed through district newsletter articles.
- 5. Upon request of the District Governor, a review of this policy and guidelines may be made in accordance with current District 14-T Constitution and Bylaws.
