PENN NATIONAL LI SUSAN M C Hopefully everyone had a pleasant Thanksgiving. It's a great time to reflect on our blessings. We're very fortunate to have opportunities for education, equality, and access to water where we live. In other parts of the world and even here in the U.S., others are not as fortunate. This month I'm continuing to share information about sustainable development goals that impact human needs and environmental needs. You can learn more about it at <u>Take Action for the Sustainable Development Goals – United Nations</u> <u>Sustainable Development</u>.

Of the 17-sustainable development goals, #4-#6 include helping educate children; empowering women and girls and ensuring their equal rights: and avoid wasting water, respectively. You may be wondering why I'm writing about education and equal rights; however, human needs connect with environmental needs. Children represent our future, in so many ways. According to LCI, in April 2020, 1.6 billion children were out of school and nearly 369 million children who relied on school meals had to find other sources for their daily nutrition. Keeping kids in school is essential. Regarding gender equality, not only is it a fundamental human right, it's a necessary foundation for a peaceful, prosperous, and sustainable world, according to LCI. Globally, more girls are going to school and fewer girls are being forced into early marriage. Unfortunately, with the pandemic, violence against women and girls has steeply increased and women have been disproportionately impacted not only at work but also at home due to the traditional roles of women as care givers. Research shows that gender equality is linked to peace. Regarding clean water and sanitation, 3 out of 10 people lack access to safe drinking water and 6 out of 10 people lack access to safe sanitation, according to LCI. Additionally, while 80% of wastewater is discharged without any treatment into rivers or seas, 70% of water from water sources is used for irrigation. Hence, daily, nearly 1,000 children die due to preventable water and sanitation-related diarrheal diseases. Access to clean water and good hygiene practices are imperative to combatting the pandemic and other diseases.

The aforementioned Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. They address the global challenges we face. You can learn more at www.un.org and consider how you can take action.

Special note:

When submitting contributions, if clubs/individuals **do not specify** which program or project is intended, contributions will **automatically go toward Operating Expenses**.

- (1) 500 club \$5 per member contribution along with a current list of members (to validate contribution amount)
- (2) Carl Shoemaker Award –.\$500 donation to recognize and acknowledge a deserving Lion. Very attractive medal and plaque is awarded. (Named for blind camp founder Carl Shoemake).
- (3) Project New Hope Disabled Veteran Project, physical or emotional disability. Two five-day Retreats provided each summer at no cost to disabled <u>PA veterans</u>. Funds are needed/welcomed to help continue this worthwhile project for those who have served.
- (4) Camper Sponsorships Prices range from \$450 to \$700 depending upon the type of camp session (5 types). Camp counselor sponsorship \$250. Camping sessions usually June through August.
- (5) Brick walkway Brick price range \$100 -\$500 dependent upon brick size. Can be in memory or in honor of Lions Clubs/individuals. (\$1,000 Wall block)



Again this school year, the West Hanover Township Lions Club will support local students with two \$1,000 scholarships and two \$500 grants.

The scholarships are for students with visual impairments and for grads pursuing higher education in a program related to environmental studies. The vision and environmental scholarships are available to graduates who reside in the area covered by the CD School District regardless of the school they attend, or even if they are home-schooled. In conjunction with the town's tree-lighting on Nov 19, there were nearly 1200 visitors that night.




