Club visits started early this year. Blue Ridge Mason Dixon was visited July 18 and I visited the G-A Blue Leo Club today, July 31. Two visits are



Finally, I know most clubs that file 990's for the last Lions Year due Nov 15 received a letter from the Internal Revenue Service during July. The letter stated that all 990's (N,EZ) must be filed electronically with the Lions Year that ended June 30. The fact is that a paper return can no longer be filed in that there is no longer an address to mail one to. For clubs with gross receipts under \$50,000, a 990-N can be filed for free on the IRS website, The charities and nonprofits area has a spot where a 990-N can be filed. Those inputting them will need to create an account which involves coming up with a username and a password. I filed our 990-EZ for the district using a provider named Form 990 Online for free and received an acknowledgement form the IRS that the filing was accepted.

I also received 50 new member kits from LCI this month. They are in my garage along with the extra directories.



FROM OUR ENVIRONMENTAL CHAIR

Greetings District Members. I hope this finds everyone well and enjoying our summer weather. Some parts of the country are seeing extreme weather events with record heat, drought conditions, wildfires, flooding, etc. We're pretty fortunate here in District 14-T, although, we may occasionally see some temperature spikes for a few consecutive days. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) offers the following tips for safely enjoying a healthy summer:

- 1. Get at least 150-minutes of aerobic physical activity each week.
- 2. Wear sunscreen (at least SPF 15, reapply after 2-hours) and insect repellant (along with long sleeve shirts and long pants to avoid insect bites).
- 3. Keep cool in extreme heat (use fans or AC, stay hydrated, and keep informed).
- 4. Eat healthy foods.
- 5. Drink water (instead of sugary drinks or alcoholic drinks).
- 6. Avoid tobacco use.

Previously, I shared that I raise Monarch butterflies. July was a great month and we recently released 8-Monarch butterflies (4/female and 4/male). Pollinators are very important and contribute to about 1/3rd of the food that we eat. One super easy thing that anyone can do is set up a bee watering station (pictured below). Materials include a container, a few rocks, and water. Ensure that the materials are clean and fill the container with water until the rocks are half submerged. The goal is to provide a water source for bees so that they don't drown. Bird baths are often too steep and deep for bees. Place the watering station in a location that bees frequent such as near a garden and clean the container and rocks as needed. You can also watch a guick YouTube video on this at How to make a bee watering station - YouTube. I also previously shared with you about the 17-sustainable development goals (SDG) from www.un.org. We're now up to goals #16-#17. This includes #16-Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions; and #17-Partnerships for the Goals. #16 Peace, Justice, and Strong Institutions impacts our communities and how residents feel safe within their communities. We're currently witnessing the largest number of violent conflicts globally since 1946 and 25% of the global population lives in conflict-affected countries (as of 2020). One third of the world's population – mostly women – fear walking alone in their neighborhoods at night. And, a record 100-million people have been forcibly displaced worldwide (as of May 2020). While this sustainable development goal is very people-focused, it doesn't measure as relevantly as some of the other goals.

#17-Partnerships for the Goals is a goal made us. We excel at building partnerships. A main objective of goal #17 is to build strong and global partnerships to achieve the sustainable development goals. We can do that within our communities as well. We can build robust, effective collaborations that maximize partnership impact and generate greater outcomes for all of our community projects, including environment projects. MILITARY SHARE PROJECT

The 14T newsletter has contained information about our Military Share Project which is developing into a hugh success. There has been a change in the distribution day of the week, from Tuesday to the first **THURSDAY** of each month. The time to report for the volunteers has also been changed from 9:30 am to **8:30 am.** The veterans will be picking up their items from 10:00 to 12:00 also instead of 11:00 to 1:00.

We are trying very hard to make this project a zone or even district project. We would love to see at least one person from each club if at all possible. Just a description of the operation in case you did not read the first article. The trucks from the Pa. Central Food Bank will arrive approximately 8:30- to 9:00 am. Before the truck arrives long tables are set up and bags are ready for items. Meats (several kind), chicken, eggs, milk, bread and a 20lb box of fresh produce plus another box with much needed items is also prepacked for each veteran.. Also if the veteran has died their widow/widower is eligible. The volunteers unpack the boxes of meats, etc and start loading the bags. These are items which are individually packed in large boxes. Skids are used to move these items inside the building.. We are set up like a production line and it is very effective. If the veteran is living with family food is also provided for everyone in the home. The cars are directed to form a line around the distribution building and the bags and boxes are placed in each car or truck.

Nothing warms your heart as much as walking up to a vehicle and finding a widow sitting there with tears of joy, as she described it, running down her cheeks and being told how grateful she was for this food. A beautiful moment in time.!!





West Hanover Lions Club Provides Scholarships and Grants


Again this school year, the West Hanover Township Lions Club will support local students with two \$1,000 scholarships and two \$500 grants.

In addition to the annual scholarships, the West Hanover Lions are continuing to provide two \$500 grants for the Central Dauphin Vision and Autism Support Programs.

The West Hanover Lions also make contributions: to support cutting edge equipment at the Penn State Hershey Eye Center, to fund the West Hanover Senior Van Service, to help families affected by disasters, to assist community residents with visual needs, to support local youth athletic teams and facilities, and to sponsor visually impaired campers at the PA Beacon Lodge Camp.
