
this next Lions year!

Greetings Lions and Leos,

I hope you are all well and safe. I am honored to be the District Governor Elect of 14-T!

I look forward to serving under incoming International President, Brian Sheehan whose theme will be "Together We Can". International Convention for 2022 is set to take place in Montreal June 2 – June 28. COVID has made the trip significantly more interesting.

Work on the 2022-23 Directory is ongoing. As of this moment, we have 9 clubs throughout our District that have not reported officers to LCI (which means 30 have Thank you). I have also started a schedule for District Governor party visits for 2022-23, reached out to all 39 Clubs, and I have confirmed 21 visits so far.

This Sunday will be our last Cabinet Meeting for this Lions Year and it's an important one in that this is where we make decisions on where and how the project money received from our Clubs is disbursed. There will also be discussion regarding the introduction of expense reporting for the Vice Governors and the Zone Chairs.

The LCI E-book has been emailed to all who committed to serve (Many thanks to Dwight Steinly, Lisa Lugovich, Bryan DeMuro, Bob Letson, Darrell Miller, and Crystal Alleman)) as well as a copy of the zone meeting report. Zone chairs are a crucial link between the clubs in the zone and the district. 3 zone meetings a year are needed as well as accompanying the DG party at club visits. Monitoring the monthly Club Health Assessment Report is helpful.

As stated last month, my theme for next Lions Year will be "Together We Can Serve More". Pin design has been finalized and I expect to receive them early next week (likely not in time for this weekend's meeting). Next year there will be a lot of emphasis on the Global Membership Approach and again I am quite pleased to have Lion Doug Long serving as Chair for next Lions year.



We've all heard about the "great worker shortage" — everywhere you look, businesses have help wanted signs hanging, and you hear about sign-on bonuses being paid by those who normally don't offer them and unusually high wages being offered. As the State Project that has a large number of workers to hire every year, Beacon Lodge has been impacted by these circumstances. Nursing, Kitchen, and Program departments are all significantly understaffed, despite a lot of effort and funding applied to recruiting.

Scheduled for the 2022 summer are the following sessions: 1 Transitional, 3
Assisted Living, 1 Camp Unite, and 2 Visually Impaired sessions in the Adult Camp
and 1 LEAP, 1 Ad(h)dventure, 1 ConnXions, 2 Camp Unite, and 2 Project New

Hope in the Children's Village. Full staffing of the seasonal positions includes 44 workers.

We currently have 13.

Due to the staffing shortage and the Session #1 camper counts in Adult Camp and Children's Village, those sessions have been cancelled. Our campers will be given the option to join a later session. Camp now begins on June 11th.

Please let this serve as the official call for help. We are in critical need of volunteers to make Camp 2022 happen. I'm sure we've all encountered businesses that are closed when they should be open because they don't have the staff to keep their regular hours, and even businesses that have gone under because they cannot pay the high wages job seekers have come to expect. Beacon Lodge is in danger of not being able to serve the Special Needs community this season. This is an opportunity for the Lions of Pennsylvania to show that when circumstances make a project seem impossible, we will be there to find a way to serve those who need it most because where there is a need, there is a Lion.

Your Camp has a need - Let's meet this challenge together.

If you or someone you know has experience in or a desire for helping individuals with special needs, cooking for large groups, or is an LPN/RN please contact us at 814-542-2511 or office@beaconlodge.org today! We need individuals to fill Counselor, Cook, and Nurse positions. All positions require PA ChildLine, State Police Background, and FBI Fingerprint Clearances. Those interested in volunteering as a Counselor will also need CPR/First Aid and Mandated Reporter certifications. All of these can be completed online, except for the CPR/First Aid. We are trying to set up a second training on June 11 at Beacon Lodge. You may also find options available to you locally.

PENNSYLVANIA LIONS BEACON LODGE CAMP JOB DESCRIPTION

Counselor DUTIES (Include but are not limited to)

- Understand Camp Policy and Camp Rules.
- Assist the campers in increasing independence, experiencing community membership, increasing social skills, building peer relationships, and increasing self-confidence.
- Cooperate with the entire staff in working together for the welfare of the camp and campers.
- · Supervise and lead small and large group activities.
- · Participate in the set-up and cleanup of games and crafts.
- · Adapt activities, as needed, to allow active participation by the campers.
- Provide additional assistance (e.g., interpreting instructions, providing physical assistance (including personal care) in order to help the campers learn recreational skills.
- Prepare camper progress reports and award certificates.
- · Ensure the facility is clean and safe.
- Other duties as assigned.

Cook DUTIES (Include but are not limited to)

- Understand and follow all Camp Policies, Camp Rules, DOH guidelines, and ServSafe guidelines.
- · Prepare and serve meals.
- Maintain proper food storage.
- Maintain proper leftovers storage and utilization of leftovers per camp menus.
- Assist Kitchen Supervisor with food and supply inventory.
- Maintain equipment, utensils, preparation areas, serving areas, and refuse receptacles in a clean and sanitary manner.
- Remove kitchen and dining area refuse.
- Manage Kitchen Helpers in conjunction with the Kitchen Supervisor.
- Other tasks as assigned.

Nursing volunteers must have a current RN or LPN license.

We must strictly adhere to camper to counselor ratios, so we are asking for volunteers for entire sessions. The sessions with the most volunteers needed are Session 7 and 8. Please see the camp calendar for session dates. We also need to know the number of volunteers for each session in order to determine our maximum camper count for the session. We need to have confirmation of volunteers at least two weeks before a session begins to make that determination.

Thank you for considering becoming a volunteer for a session at Beacon Lodge! We look forward to hearing from you.

MILITARY SHARE PROJECT

Last month I came upon an article concerning an organization serving our Vets. It is called Military Share Project. After emailing the head of the group, one of our club members and myself volunteered to help, basically just to see what it was about. The group meets at 425 Franklin Farm Road (near Sheetz on Rt. 30). We were unaware that it was their first distribution and just the start of a wonderful program.

We met about 9:30 or so and the Pa. Central Food Bank truck pulled in loaded with food for 97 vets who had pre-registered for the program. After organizing the sorting tables, frozen meat one place, hot dogs on another table, dairy-milk, eggs and cheese on another we begin packing bags with the items. Also prepacked were boxes with chicken, etc. and also a 20lb box of fresh produce.

Around 11:00 cars were checked in and began the drive thru (around the building - next to the old prison). Each car received a box of produce, box of chicken, etc, bag of dairy products, large bag of beef products. Larger families were given larger amounts of each. Such wonderful smiles and many many were so grateful. We were finished about 1:30.

They also held an expo (drive thru) which they needed help with and on the 16th and 17th of the May they asked for volunteers to help put flags on the veterans' graves in 5 Chambersburg cemeteries.

They will be holding more events for our vets. One thing I would like to mention, I am hoping our clubs will cross their boundaries, as our soldiers did in their service to their country and work together Lions Club beside Lions Club. Together We Serve.

Now information for the volunteers: You will be standing on a cement floor, there are no chairs to sit down so you are on your feet.

You can work a couple hours or the entire time. Just want to be honest about it. The organizers are right there beside you working also.

I would like to partner with this group and show the world how much we as Lions care. Won't you help, Show how big your heart is, honor these fine men and women.

HERSHEY LIONS CLUB

LOCAL ORGANIZATIONS DONATE USED EYEGLASSES TO THE HERSHEY LIONS CLUB

Derry Township, PA – In an unprecedented dual presentation of used eyeglasses by two local organizations, the Hershey Lions Club received almost 2,500 pairs of used eyeglasses at its recent May meeting held at the Hershey History Center.

The Federated Women's Club of Hershey previously donated 130-pairs of used eyeglasses in 2020 and another 176-pairs of used eyeglasses that had been collected during 2021 were currently being presented by Carol Foley, the state and local club chairperson for the project. She noted that initially, the statewide goal of the General Federated Women's Clubs of Pennsylvania was to collect 2,020 pairs of used eyeglasses and that the overall statewide effort greatly exceeded expectations yielding 7,692 pairs of used eyeglasses. Organizations similar to the Hershey Lions Club were recipients of these glasses across the state.

Also donating used eyeglasses was Linda E. Watson, member of the Order of the Eastern Start Hershey Chapter and Worthy Grand Matron of the Grand Chapter of PA, OES, Inc. Watson has been serving in the 4-year leadership position and has supported used eyeglass collections since 2017. 


HONORING HELEN KELLER

"Although the world is full of suffering, it is full also of the overcoming of it."

— Helen Keller

Ms. Keller was very inspirational. As a young person she was quite familiar with the struggles and suffering in her life, but she found a way of becoming a master at "overcoming" it. She valued the independence she was able to obtain, even though she was blind and deaf, and worked tirelessly that others might learn and share a similar quality of life that she achieved.



Please honor Helen Keller and support the mission of Vision Resources and with your contribution we will work to achieve greater independence for blind and visually impaired individuals. Ms. Keller was born in 1880, remember her on her birthday, June 27, thank you.



Keller attended Radcliffe College of Harvard University and became the first deafblind person to earn a Bachelor of Arts degree.

In 1915, along with renowned city planner George Kessler, she co-founded Helen Keller International to combat the causes and consequences of blindness and malnutrition.

In 1920, she helped found the American Civil Liberties Union.

When the American Federation for the Blind was established in 1921, Keller had an effective national outlet for her efforts. She became a member in 1924, and participated in many campaigns to raise awareness, money and support for the blind.
