Message from 1VDG Dennis

Greetings Lions and Leos,

I hope you are all well and safe. March involved visits to the last 4 clubs that were possible this Lions year. We found Lionism to be alive and well at Richfield, Ickesburg, Landisburg and Shermans Dale. DGE Training concluded March 18 after 3 weeks of online sessions. My Group 22 included 3 members from India, 1 each from the Czech Republic, Poland, and Hungary as well as Lions from 5 states, Canada, Caymans, and Trinidad. All of us will meet together late June at the International Convention in Montreal. In addition on the training side, we had a number of T members (at least 3) attend RLLI at the State Office.

Cabinet selection for next Lions year 2022-23 continues and will continue during April and yes, unfortunately is still a work in progress. Zone chairs are desperately needed for both regions 3 and 4. Zone chairs are a crucial link between the clubs in the zone and the district. 3 zone meetings a year are needed as well as accompanying the DG party at club visits. Monitoring the monthly Club Health Assessment Report is helpful.

As stated last month, my theme for next Lions Year will be "Together We Can Serve More". Pin design is still pending. Next year there will be a lot of emphasis on the Global Membership Approach.

We were glad to receive donations for our District Projects as well as learning how our individual Clubs are serving (now up to 35 visits for this Lions Year). We are presently around \$45,000 in year to date project donations (we didn't make it to \$40,000 last Lions year). We disbursed another \$2,000 during March in disaster funds to help fire victims in Duncannon impacted by a row home fire. Further, I had approximately 3,000 pairs of eyeglasses in my garage collected by 3 of our clubs during March that have since been routed to PDG Joann Williams.

A special recognition is due my club, Lurgan Township, for the spaghetti dinner held March 20 that raised \$3,500 for the Linn family who lost their home to fire in Jan.

## New Children's Village Sessions Names Same great experience!

Every now and then a little remodeling is necessary. Each year at the work weekends we spruce up the camp; This year we also spruced up the Children's Village session names. But, have no fear, we still provide the same great experience for our Campers!

- <u>Camp A.L.I.V.E</u> will now be known as <u>Camp Sensational</u>. This session is designed for individuals with Autism Spectrum Disorder and/or intellectual challenges. The Camper-to-Counselor ratio is 3:1. Dates for this session are June 4-9 and registrations are due by May 25.
- <u>Assisted Living will</u> now ben known as *L.E.A.P. (Learners who Explore Achieve and Persevere)* This session is designed for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities. The Camper-to-Counselor ratio is 4:1. Dates for this session are June 18-23 and registrations are due by June 8.
- V.I. will now be known as ConnXions. This session is designed for individuals with vision loss. The Camper-to-Counselor ratio is 6:1. Dates for this session are July 16-23 and registrations are due by July 6.
- <u>Camp Energy</u> will now be known as *Camp AD(H)Dventure*. This session is designed for individuals with ADD/ ADHD. The Camper-to-Counselor ratio is 5:1. Dates for this session are July 30—August 6 and registrations are due by July 20.
- <u>CV Family Camp</u> will now ben known as *Camp Unite*. This session is designed for families with children with disabilities. Dates for these sessions are June 11-15 and July 2-6. Registrations are due respectively by June 1 and June 22.

### Our other sessions are as follows:

### Children's Village

Project New Hope is for PA Disabled Veterans and their families. Dates for these sessions are June 25-29 and July 9-13. Registrations are due respectively June 5 and June 29.

### Adult Camp

<u>Transitional Care</u> is for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities who require minimal assistance with ADL (Activities of Daily Living) Camper-to-Counselor ratio is 3:1. Dates for these sessions are June 4-9 and June 18-23. Registrations are due respectively by May 25 and June 8.

Assisted Living is for adults with intellectual and developmental disabilities who require only verbal prompting with ADL (Activities of Daily Living) Camper-to-Counselor ratio is 4:1. Dates for these sessions are June 11-16, June 25-30, and July 9-14. Registrations are due respectively by June 1, June 15, and June 29.

\*NEW 2022\* AC Family Camp is for families with adult family members with disabilities. Dates for this session are July 2-6. Registrations are due by June 22.

V.I. is for adults with vision loss. Camper-to-Counselor ratio is 8:1. Dates for these sessions are July 16-26 and July 30-August 9. Registrations are due respectively by July 6 and July 20.

Next year our Adult Camp names will also be updated. We will continue to serve the same segments of the population of people living with special needs.



The Pin Traders Club of Pennsylvania Board members meet on Friday after the breakfast and decided to return to the Red Lion Hotel again in March of 2023.





### DISTRICT 14-C LCI CONVENTION BUS TRIP MONTREAL, CANADA June 22, 2022 through June 29, 2022 BUS TRIP INFORMATION



Based on your responses to our survey earlier this year, District 14-C is offering a bus trip to Montreal, Canada, for the 2022 Lions Clubs International Convention. The trip will begin on Wednesday, June 22, 2022 and end on Wednesday, June 29, 2022. Here is our itinerary:

### Wednesday, June 22

- Depart Wednesday, June 22nd multiple pick-up locations
- Drive to Alexandria Bay, NY, with several stops along the way to stretch, eat, and use the restroom (lunch is not included in the package)
- Check into our Alexandria Bay hotel (Riveredge Resort)
- Dinner together at a local restaurant

### Thursday, June 23

- · Breakfast at the hotel
- Shuttle boat to Heart Island and tour Bolt Castle
- Return to Alexandria Bay, board bus, and drive to Montreal Thursday afternoon
- Check into our Montreal hotel (Hotel Delta by Marriott) and pick up convention materials Thursday
   afternoon/evening

Friday, June 24, through Tuesday, June 28

- Enjoy all of the activities the LCI Convention has to offer
- · Guided bus tour of Montreal (date and time to be determined depending on the convention schedule)

Wednesday, June 29

 Board our bus and drive home, making restroom, stretch, and lunch stops along the way (lunch is not included in the package)

The cost of the trip, PER PERSON, varies depending on the number of people sharing a hotel room:

- 1 person \$1,190
- 2 people \$993 per person
- 3 people \$941 per person
- 4 people \$882 per person

THESE PRICES INCLUDE all transportation costs to and from Montreal, lodging in Alexandria Bay, dinner and breakfast in Alexandria Bay, shuttle boat to Heart Island, tour of Bolt Castle, room deposit for your Montreal hotel room, LCI Convention registration, guided bus tour of Montreal, driver's lodging in Montreal, parking fees for the bus, and driver gratuities. THESE PRICES DO NOT INCLUDE lodging in Montreal (other than your room deposit) or any meals other than dinner and breakfast in Alexandria Bay. You may subtract \$225 from the prices listed above for individuals who will not register for the LCI Convention. PLEASE NOTE - At least one registered convention attendee must occupy each room we reserve in our Montreal Hotel.

A deposit must be paid for each person registering for this trip. The deposit, PER PERSON, varies depending on the number of people sharing a room, as shown below. The deposit covers the following costs: deposit for Wolf's Bus Lines, Montreal hotel room deposit, and LCI Convention registration:

- 1 person \$475
- 2 people \$375 per person (\$150 if not registering for LCI convention)
- 3 people \$342 per person (\$117 if not registering for LCI Convention)
- 4 people \$325 per person (\$100 if not registering for LCI Convention)

Half of the remaining balance must be paid by April 1, 2022, and the remaining balance must be paid by May 1, 2022.

The nightly rate at Hotel Delta by Marriott is \$167. With taxes, the rate is just under \$200 per night. The room deposit included in your trip deposit will be credited to your hotel account. Each party will need to present a credit card at check-in, which will be used to pay for the remaining balance on your account upon check-out.

All participants on this trip will need a VALID PASSPORT to cross the border. THE PASSPORT MUST HAVE AN EXPIRATION DATE AFTER SEPTEMBER 29, 2022. Under current guidelines, anybody crossing the border into Canada MUST BE FULLY VACCINATED, SHOW THEIR VACCINATION CARD, and PROVIDE PROOF OF A NEGATIVE COVID-19 TEST within 72 hours of entry. We will continue to monitor these rules and provide updates.

We MUST HAVE at least 30 people register for the trip by JANUARY 20, 2022, to cover the deposit for Wolf's Bus Lines, which will hold our bus and our hotel rooms in Alexandria Bay. We MUST HAVE at least 40 people register by FEBRUARY 28, 2022, to confirm the trip. If we do not have 40 registered by that date, those who have registered will decide if they are willing to pay an additional fee for the trip.

If we can get 40 people to sign up for the trip by JANUARY 7, 2022, those who are registering for the LCI Convention will get a \$50 discount in their registration fee. If we have 50 or more people sign up by February 28, 2022, everyone will receive a \$50 discount on the price of the trip.

Nobody will be registered for the LCI Convention until we have at least 40 people signed up for the trip or until a group of less than 40 decides to move forward with the trip for an additional fee.

Trip insurance is available through Wolf's Bus Lines. Insurance must be purchased within 14 days of registering for the trip in order to cover cancellation due to a pre-existing health condition. This insurance will cover cancellation due to COVID-19. Participants are advised to include the cost of their hotel room in Montreal in the amount of insurance coverage they purchase.
