A MESSAGE FROM DISTRICT GOVERNOR CATHY

Greetings Lions, Lioness and Leos:



April ended with our District Convention and the election of our new District Officers. Our new District Governor Elect is Lion Peggy Hummel from the New Bloomfield Lions Club and our First Vice District Governor is Lion Dennis Alleman from the Lurgen Township Lions Club. Congratulations to our new leaders in

District 14-T. I want to thank everyone who voted in our elections and for the changes in our policies and by-laws.

Our guest speaker was International Director Allan J. Hunt from Chilliwack, British Columbia, Canada. He spoke to us about the different types of clubs he has encountered in his travels from community service clubs, a baseball club, and even a snow mobile club, all in Alaska. He also talked about the dues increase many of us have been talking about. The International Board of Directors has decided that there will not be a dues increase until it can be voted on in New Delhi, India at the 2022 Lions Convention. Another item discussed was term limits for District Governors. As of 2023, there will be NO repeating a run for District Governor, 1st VDG, 2d VDG and no Past District Governors can serve in a Zone Chair position. There will also be a term limit of 3 years for all Zone Chairs as well. What all of this means for all of us is that we need to get serious about growing leadership in our clubs and within the district.

Our 103rd international convention will be a Virtual LCI Convention [Virtual LCIcon 2021 \(lionsclubs.org\)](https://lionsclubs.org) The early bird registration rate of \$50 has been extended to 30 April and will be \$75 on 1 May Leos may attend for \$30 regardless of the date. The convention is scheduled for 25-29 June.

During the convention executive officers and international director elections will be conducted electronically, and voting procedures will be coming soon. If you wish to be a delegate please let your club secretary know. You can check for updates and details will be posted at lionsclubs.org as they become available.

Derry Township, PA -- The Federated Women's Club of Hershey recently donated 110 used prescription eyeglasses and sunglasses and 20 pairs of new readers to the Hershey Lions Club. This donation was part of a statewide two-year Vision Impairment Awareness project for General Federation of Women's Club Pennsylvania.

Carol Foley, state and local club chairman, reported, "The statewide goal was to collect 2020 pairs of used eyeglasses by May, 2022. That goal was surpassed with 2,045 eyeglasses collected by December, 2020. The collection will continue in 2021 culminating at the GFWC Pennsylvania convention in May, 2022." "We're happy to partner with the Federated Women's Club of Hershey to help the visually impaired. This collaboration continues to be a meaningful way to expand the service impact of both organizations," added Hershey Lions Club President, Steve Gallerizzo.

Glasses that are collected locally in the future will again be donated to the Hershey Lions Club to help needy people around the world. Derry Township, PA -- The Hershey Lions Club recently assisted the Hershey History Center, home of the Hershey-Derry Township Historical Society, with its beautification project. With the exception of 2020, the Hershey Lions have for several years assisted this Derry Township organization with sprucing up the exterior of its building.

“We’re happy to partner with the Hershey-Derry Township Historical Society to help with its beautification project. This collaboration also continues to be a positive way to help the environment,” shared Hershey Lions Club President, Steve Gallerizzo. 14-members of the Hershey Lions Club worked on Saturday, May 1st, to weed, edge, relocate plants, and apply mulch at the center’s barn. “Applying organic mulch contributes to healthy soil, erosion and weed control, and water conservation,” added Gallerizzo.

The Hershey Lions Club is part of Lions Clubs International (LCI) and supports causes both locally and globally. Since 1925, Lions have served to prevent avoidable blindness and improve quality of life for people who are blind and visually impaired. The Hershey Lions Club provides volunteer opportunities for service-minded men and women in the community. 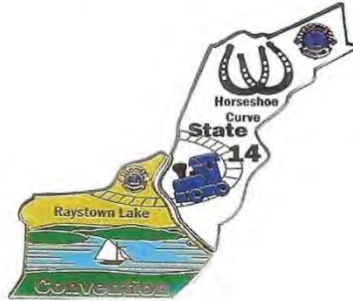
