NORTHEAST PA LIONS SERVICE FOUNDATION REPORT

The NEPALSF is pleased to announce two additional board members from District 14T; Lion Tom Klaus and PDG Keldeen Stambaugh. We are excited about the new talents and perspectives they bring to the foundation's work.

The election of officers was conducted at the September board meeting. By a unanimous vote, PDG Gerald Chapman will continue as board president, PDG George Hilsinger was elected first vice-president and PCC Ron Dietz will continue as second vice-president. PDG Kathy Neary serves as secretary and Lion Bob Dickson is our treasurer for 2022.

A long-range planning committee has been formed to ensure that the foundation remains financially strong, aware of emerging technologies that help the vision and hearing impaired, and forward-looking. The NEPALSF board continues to explore ways to improve to our website, <u>www.nepalsf.org</u> to make it more informative and user friendly. I will keep you advised of changes.

Since the beginning of the new Lions' year, the NEPALSF has awarded nearly \$58,000 in grants. Some of these include the New Bloomfield Lions (14T) who were awarded \$3,648 for a patient care grant to provide hearing aids. The Jersey Shore Lions (14G) were granted \$16,220 to enable North Central Sight Services to provide rehabilitative and social outings for their clients. The JLW Mountain Laurel club (14W) received \$2000 to provide new bedding for the Sleep in Heavenly Peace community project. The Lakemont Lions (14L) were granted \$15,000 for their Lions Quest community project. Heartfelt thank-you's were recently received by the foundation from three scholarship recipients at Salus University.

MESSAGE FROM OUR ENVIRONMENTAL CHAIR

Hopefully everyone is enjoying the cooler weather in anticipation of fall's beautiful foliage. It's a great reason to get outside and enjoy nature! This month I'm sharing information about sustainable development goals that impact human needs and environmental needs. You can learn more about it at <u>Take Action for</u> the Sustainable Development Goals – United Nations Sustainable Development.

Of the 17-sustainable development goals, #1-#3 include eliminating poverty, eliminating hunger, and promoting good health and well-being, respectively. **Goal #1**, eliminating poverty, encourages us to donate what we don't use. According to LCI, more than 700-million people live in extreme poverty and we can help insure social protections especially for children and other vulnerable groups. By donating unused or unwanted items, we're living sustainably and it means that we're not exhausting all of our resources.

Goal #2, eliminating hunger, creates a great opportunity for us to waste less food and support local farmers. According to LCI, one third of the world's food is wasted, however, about 821 million people are undernourished. Supporting local farmers means that local food is fresher and less resources are used such as fuel and transportation, to obtain it.

Goal #3 regarding good health and well-being, is important now more than ever. LCI encourages that ensuring healthy lives and promoting well-being for everyone is essential to sustainable development. LCI also promotes vaccinations as a way of ensuring good health and notes that measles vaccinations resulted in an 80% drop in measles deaths between 2000 to 2017. The last 1+ year has shown us how imperative good health and well-being is.

Physical activity, especially while enjoying the outdoors, has several benefits, according to challengethestorm.org. These benefits include reduced mental fatigue, reduced stress, reduced depression and anxiety, and mood elevation. If we collectively set a goal to accomplish one thing towards goal #1, #2, or #3, we can have a big impact!

LEOS UPDATE THE STORY WALK AT THE GREENBELT PAXTANG TRAILHEAD




