MESSAGE FROM ENVIRONMENTAL CHAIR

According to Punxsutawney Phil, we can anticipate six more weeks of winter! He saw his shadow [this morning](#). But don't despair, we have an Environmental Photo Contest coming to lift your spirits. Please be on the lookout for an email with the details.

DG Peg recently shared news of environmental projects occurring around the district during a recent club visit. Clubs from 14T are performing tree plantings, community gardens, and recycling projects, to name a few. This is inspiring news.

When I last wrote here, we reviewed #4-#6 of the 17-sustainable development goals. These goals stem from the United Nations and are embraced by Lions Clubs International and many organizations globally, including here in the United States. While some of these goals are very environment related, others have social impacts, however are interdependent with each other. Goals #7-#9 involve: access to affordable and clean energy, decent work and economic growth, and resilient infrastructure, respectively. Regarding #7, energy, improvement is especially needed in the heating and transport sectors by becoming more renewable. In our communities at this time of year, there's opportunity to help residents who need heat assistance. Regarding #8, global employment saw the loss of 255-million full time jobs due to the pandemic. This especially impacted young women at 31% not employed nor in school, nor in training. This creates opportunities in our communities for clubs to engage with other organizations to find solutions to unmet needs.

Lastly, goal #9, resilient infrastructure includes sustainable industry and fosters innovation. According to the UN, the relationship between social and industrial development can lead to "employment creation, poverty eradication, gender equality, labor standards, and greater access to education and health care." Sustainable industry is one that embraces practices that produce long-term benefits for many. You can learn more at www.un.org and consider how your club can take action.

The aforementioned Sustainable Development Goals are the blueprint to achieve a better and more sustainable future for all. They address the global challenges we face.

What is an RLLI?

The Multiple District 14 **Regional Lions Leadership Institute (RLLI)** is a highly concentrated, fast paced, long weekend of instruction designed to train potential Lions leaders who are committed to seeking positions of leadership (club, district and state) throughout Pennsylvania.

Who are the instructors?

The RLLI instructors are highly trained Lions who have the necessary skills to conduct the training that is in the curriculum. Instructors include International Directors, PIDs, graduates of Lions Certified Presenter Program, Lions University Masters and Doctorate recipients and experienced Past District Governors.

What subjects are taught?

The subjects include material suitable for Lions leaders. The curriculum is approved by Lions Clubs International prior to the conduct of classes; it is shown in the box above.

What are the instruction days?

We begin at 1:00 PM Friday, March 11, 2022 and conclude Sunday, March 13, 2022 around 3:00 PM.

What is the cost?

Thanks to a "LCI Leadership Development" grant, the registration fee is only \$175.00 per student. This fee includes materials, hotel room and meals.

How many students?

There is a limit of 40 students for the RLLI. There is no limit on the number of Lions a district may register. We will have a standby list to fill a vacancy if needed.

Why attend an RLLI?

Attendance at the RLLI does not guarantee that you will be selected for positions of Leadership in your district, but it does prepare you to take on positions of increasing responsibility by giving you the building blocks that are required to be a successful leader. Attendance at an RLLI also presents to you an opportunity to meet and get acquainted with Lions from across Pennsylvania who may become future leaders.







Plastic Bag Recycling/Park Benches

The Hershey Lions Club has begun collecting plastic bags and other plastic film materials for recycling into park benches to be placed around the Derry Township. We encourage residents to participate in this service project with us. This service project not only helps the environment by cutting back on discarded plastic bags, but also assists in obtaining additional benches to be placed around the township.

How it works

We currently have recycling receptacles placed at the Hershey Public Library and Grace United Methodist Church (433 E. Main Street, Hummelstown). Recyclables include plastic shopping bags, bubble wrap, plastic shrink wrap, newspaper delivery bags, and similar products. This does not include plastic bottles nor other "hard" plastics. We can obtain one bench every 6 months so long as we collect 500 pounds of plastic.

MONTREAL, CANADA
June 22, 2022 through June 29, 2022
BUS TRIP INFORMATION**



Based on your responses to our survey earlier this year, District 14-C is offering a bus trip to Montreal, Canada, for the 2022 Lions Clubs International Convention. The trip will begin on Wednesday, June 22, 2022 and end on Wednesday, June 29, 2022. Here is our itinerary:

Wednesday, June 22

- Depart Wednesday, June 22nd - multiple pick-up locations
- Drive to Alexandria Bay, NY, with several stops along the way to stretch, eat, and use the restroom (lunch is not included in the package)
- Check into our Alexandria Bay hotel (Riveredge Resort)
- Dinner together at a local restaurant

Thursday, June 23

- Breakfast at the hotel
- Shuttle boat to Heart Island and tour Bolt Castle
- Return to Alexandria Bay, board bus, and drive to Montreal Thursday afternoon
- Check into our Montreal hotel (Hotel Delta by Marriott) and pick up convention materials Thursday afternoon/evening

Friday, June 24, through Tuesday, June 28

- Enjoy all of the activities the LCI Convention has to offer
- Guided bus tour of Montreal (date and time to be determined depending on the convention schedule)

Wednesday, June 29

- Board our bus and drive home, making restroom, stretch, and lunch stops along the way (lunch is not included in the package)

The cost of the trip, PER PERSON, varies depending on the number of people sharing a hotel room:

- 1 person - \$1,190
- 2 people - \$993 per person
- 3 people - \$941 per person
- 4 people - \$882 per person

THESE PRICES INCLUDE all transportation costs to and from Montreal, lodging in Alexandria Bay, dinner and breakfast in Alexandria Bay, shuttle boat to Heart Island, tour of Bolt Castle, room deposit for your Montreal hotel room, LCI Convention registration, guided bus tour of Montreal, driver's lodging in Montreal, parking fees for the bus, and driver gratuities. THESE PRICES DO NOT INCLUDE lodging in Montreal (other than your room deposit) or any meals other than dinner and breakfast in Alexandria Bay. You may subtract \$225 from the prices listed above for individuals who will not register for the LCI Convention. PLEASE NOTE - At least one registered convention attendee must occupy each room we reserve in our Montreal Hotel.

A deposit must be paid for each person registering for this trip. The deposit, PER PERSON, varies depending on the number of people sharing a room, as shown below. The deposit covers the following costs: deposit for Wolf's Bus Lines, Montreal hotel room deposit, and LCI Convention registration:

- 1 person - \$475
- 2 people - \$375 per person (\$150 if not registering for LCI convention)
- 3 people - \$342 per person (\$117 if not registering for LCI Convention)
- 4 people - \$325 per person (\$100 if not registering for LCI Convention)

Half of the remaining balance must be paid by April 1, 2022, and the remaining balance must be paid by May 1, 2022.

The nightly rate at Hotel Delta by Marriott is \$167. With taxes, the rate is just under \$200 per night. The room deposit included in your trip deposit will be credited to your hotel account. Each party will need to present a credit card at check-in, which will be used to pay for the remaining balance on your account upon check-out.

All participants on this trip will need a VALID PASSPORT to cross the border. THE PASSPORT MUST HAVE AN EXPIRATION DATE AFTER SEPTEMBER 29, 2022. Under current guidelines, anybody crossing the border into Canada MUST BE FULLY VACCINATED, SHOW THEIR VACCINATION CARD, and PROVIDE PROOF OF A NEGATIVE COVID-19 TEST within 72 hours of entry. We will continue to monitor these rules and provide updates.

We MUST HAVE at least 30 people register for the trip by JANUARY 20, 2022, to cover the deposit for Wolf's Bus Lines, which will hold our bus and our hotel rooms in Alexandria Bay. We MUST HAVE at least 40 people register by FEBRUARY 28, 2022, to confirm the trip. If we do not have 40 registered by that date, those who have registered will decide if they are willing to pay an additional fee for the trip.

If we can get 40 people to sign up for the trip by JANUARY 7, 2022, those who are registering for the LCI Convention will get a \$50 discount in their registration fee. If we have 50 or more people sign up by February 28, 2022, everyone will receive a \$50 discount on the price of the trip.

Nobody will be registered for the LCI Convention until we have at least 40 people signed up for the trip or until a group of less than 40 decides to move forward with the trip for an additional fee.

Trip insurance is available through Wolf's Bus Lines. Insurance must be purchased within 14 days of registering for the trip in order to cover cancellation due to a pre-existing health condition. This insurance will cover cancellation due to COVID-19. Participants are advised to include the cost of their hotel room in Montreal in the amount of insurance coverage they purchase.
