A STATEWIDE PROJECT – THE JARED BOX

Mark your calendars now – May 16-29, 2024, our State Convention. It will be held right here in Harrisburg at the Red Lion Hotel.

Each year a Service Project is included during the Convention. This years' Service Project will be packing **Jared Boxes**.

You ask: What is a **Jared Box**? A **Jared Box** is a plastic shoe-sized storage box filled with small gifts, toys, games, crayons, coloring books, and fun activities. Each box contains items selected for a specific age (from infant through teens) and gender. The boxes are given to children in the hospital to provide a special, fun diversion.

About The Jared Box Project

The project was started in 2001 by the children of Our Lady of Victory School in State College, Pennsylvania, to honor their classmate, **Jared**, who battled cancer with courage and faith. **Jared** was diagnosed with an incurable brainstem tumor in 1999. He carried a backpack full of toys and games to all appointments and questioned why the other children didn't bring toys to their exam rooms. **Jared** shared his toys and invited the other children to join him in a game of UNO. At just 5 years old, he demonstrated faith, wisdom and compassion for others.

After **Jared** passed away, his classmates decided to honor him by creating **Jared Boxes**. The school children made 81 **Jared Boxes** for the children at Geisinger Janet Weis Children's Hospital in Danville, Pennsylvania. Soon after that, other community groups started making **Jared Boxes**. They picked up where **Jared** left off and shared toys with the children in the hospital. This wave of kindness quickly took off and spread across the country.

Since 2001, more than 1,000,000 **Jared Boxes** have been delivered to over 500 hospitals across the United States. Boxes filled with the "gift of play" are given to young patients in emergency rooms, hospital rooms, surgical centers and clinics. 121 hospitals in Pennsylvania are participating – **Jared Boxes** made at the Convention will be going to Pennsylvania hospitals.

Lions Clubs throughout our Multiple District will be asked to make a donation to provide the items to complete our **Jared Boxes**.

We recently celebrated our 75th Anniversary with a fundraising gala in State College, PA. The attendance should have been better; however, we did have a successful silent auction. Currently, if PA Lions Clubs do not increase our donations and the camp continues to "live off" their investments, the board of directors will have to make some difficult decisions. We are very hopeful that these decisions won't be necessary.

Our district Lions Clubs have supported PA Lions Beacon Lodge by sponsoring campers, donating Wish List Items, sponsoring and providing teams for our the golf tournament (major fundraising) and work weekends. We appreciate all the support either monetary or physical labor.

There are several avenues available for our district clubs to support PA Lions:

- Recognize a deserving club member with Carl Shoemaker Award (\$500.00 contribution).
- Recognize a deserving club member with a brick or wall block on the brick walkway (\$100.00-4"x8", \$250.00-8"x8" or \$500.00-12"x12" or \$1,000.00 wall block-7"x18")

BEACON LODGE DONATIONS

Any homeowner can expect certain finances to be faced each month, even after the homes are paid for expenses still exist. Regular maintenance takes its toll. Then something happens and unforeseen repairs need to be made.

The same thing applies to Beacon Lodge. Maintenance of facilities is ongoing and necessary. And any unscheduled maintenance which cannot be known beforehand will intervene.

Yes, this all takes money. Where does the money come from? Large amounts are donated by the Lions Clubs of Pennsylvania. Each individual Lion can assist by using what some refer to as a painless process, you set it up and it just works.

I am referring to automatic payments from your bank to Beacon Lodge. You are in control - you set the amount to be paid, you set the frequency of payments, weekly, monthly, quarterly or whatever fits your budget. And you can stop it anytime.

Billpay is one method, whatever your bank supports is what you will probably use.

I checked with the Director of Beacon Lodge and he suggested designating any such payments to the Operating Fund. The payments can then be designated to meet the needs they have. It could be used for paying bills or funding a camper who needs help.

Information provided at the most recent Beacon Lodge Board meeting, Dec 3, 2023, included several financing recommendations for Lions and Clubs:

- 1) Each Lion in Pennsylvania age 72 or 73 is asked to consider a Qualified Charitable Distribution as part of their Required Minimum Distribution from Investments. This is a separate reduction on tax returns beside standard and itemized deductions. Check with your tax advisor.
- 2) Lions under 72 consider accumulating \$50.00 per year by giving up something each month.
- 3) Request grants from Foundations, Pa. Parks and Recreation Depot, Solicit large corporations , sports teams. celebrities, businesses , individuals (lottery winners?) etc.
- 4) Lions Clubs conduct one fundraiser per year dedicated to Beacon Lodge.

LEOS SEEK YOUR SUPPORT

The Penbrook Leo Club has been making plans to expand their community garden project. They are participating in the Seed Money fundraising challenge. The Leos have financially supported their local food pantry since 2010 but wanted to do more to alleviate food insecurity in their community. In early 2021, the Leos acquired the use of an empty plot of land and the garden was established in 2022 with the help of grant funding from Lions International and the Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation. The garden's harvest of fresh vegetables supplements the canned and nonperishable items provided to approximately 350 people monthly at the Manna Food Pantry.

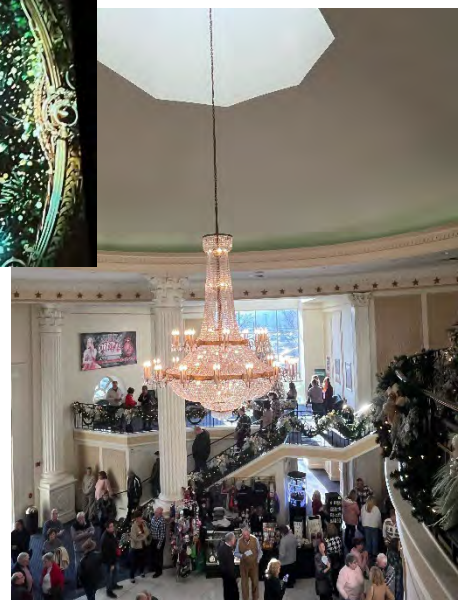
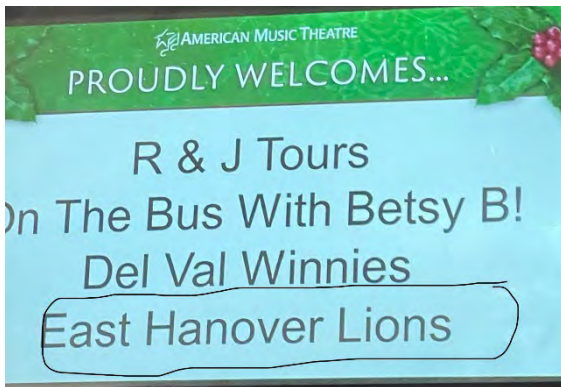
