I greatly appreciate the kindness and support I received this Lions Year. And it's a debt that will be hard to repay. Many service projects and much fundraising are taking place all across our District. Please keep up the good work.

Please remember that our district team is here to support and listen to the clubs and not the other way around. 2-way communication is vital to the success of our District 14-T and our clubs. And, we continue to be blessed with donations from many of these clubs toward our District projects.

The State Convention was held in Indiana, PA May 18-20. Highlight was Int'l President Brian Sheehan presenting the State Leo of the year award to Leo Josh Johnson of the G/A Blue Leos. His entire family attended (except for the dog). It was great to see many who made the trip from T there. Planning for the 2024 State Convention (that our district is hosting) is well under way.

Our last Cabinet Meeting is scheduled for June 4 at 2PM at the West Hanover Community Building. This traditionally is the meeting where decisions are made regarding distribution of the District Projects money received from our clubs. That process will not be as time consuming as years past. Most of the contributions to Lions Club international Foundation were done early this year to give clubs the proper credit needed to award Melvin Jones Fellows for their upcoming Charter Events. Beacon Lodge, Leader Dogs, LOPF, PA Sight Conservation and Research, and Vision Resources are done each quarter in accordance with project guidelines. We have a funding strategy for Special Olympics that matches the 3 chapters located within T with donations from clubs in those particular counties. PA Lions Care for the Kids, PA Lions for Dog Guides, and Northeast PA Lions Service Foundation are set as to where they get remitted. We only disburse money from the Disaster

MESSAGE FROM OUR ENVIRONMENTAL CHAIR


Hello District Members. I hope this finds everyone well.

When last I wrote, we were 4-inches below the normal amount of rainfall for May. Now, we're about 5-inches below the normal amount of rainfall for this time of year. You may notice your grass in your yard becoming much drier and outdoor plants, especially container plants, needing extra attention. Please be extra mindful of how wildfires get started and take precautions to prevent them.

I was recently inspired by all of the environmental initiatives occurring in PA as depicted in the Pennsylvania Department of Environmental Protection's (DEP) June 2023 report [June 2023 CAC Report.pdf \(state.pa.us\)](#). It speaks to the Chesapeake Bay Watershed Restoration, legislative initiatives, the Keep PA Beautiful Program, Youth Ambassadorships, and many other efforts.

Pictured is the map of the Chesapeake Bay drainage area that includes the four counties of our district: Dauphin, Franklin, Juniata, and Perry counties. Some of us may not realize how our activities impact a body of water that sits outside of our state, however, actions that we take within our yards individually and collectively contribute to excess nitrogen, phosphorus, and sediment reaching the bay and negatively impacting its health.

All of the counties within the drainage area have submitted Countywide Action Plans [Countywide Action Plans \(pa.gov\)](#) to help improve the condition of the bay. Dauphin County, for example, will review a variety of its plans and ordinances including stormwater, evaluate areas to establish riparian buffers to stabilize stream banks and limit encroachment, forest buffers, urban forest buffers, grass buffers, urban grass buffers, manure storage, wet ponds and wetlands, fencing, supports to assist the agricultural community, University partnerships, etc., just to name a few. These Countywide Action Plans are rather extensive and merit review so that you and your club can see what is planned for your area.



It's been my pleasure to serve as the 14-T Environment Chair for the last couple years. This is my last newsletter input in this capacity. I wish all of our district members and clubs the best as you plan and pursue your environment goals.

But, we have some important dates & club actions first – 6/15/23 is the date to remember!

7/15/23-7/24/23: Target Conversion Date

Before 6/15/23: Enter all club officers for 2023-2024

Before 6/15/23: Enter service activity for events prior to 6/1/23. Reporting for 6/1/23 going forward will be in the new system after conversion

Before 6/15/23: Record any club or donations to LCIF are in the bank with the appropriate supporting documentation for recognition.

Before 6/15/23: Make sure club data is accurate for this year (2022-2023). For Example, new members, sponsors, new clubs formed, transfers and other end of year activities specific to clubs are correct and recorded in MyLion/MyLCI

- Make sure every member has an email listed and no shared emails can be used in the new LIONS PORTAL.
- Make sure member birthdays are entered since birth dates in MyLCI will be converted - even the old conversion 1/1/1900 date! Hint: in MyLCI under reports run "Member Information Update Report" and have your members update their info!
- Training is slated to begin in late April 2023 - Stay tuned!

HOW TO PRESORT EYEGLASSES

Collecting eyeglasses is a service project that many Clubs in our District are involved with. I wanted to share with you information about where those collected eyeglasses go as well as how you can presort the eyeglasses as a club project. Collected eyeglasses are taken to the New Jersey Lions Eyeglasses Recycling Center. It is located on the grounds of Katzenbach School for the Deaf in West Trenton, New Jersey. This is one of eleven recycling centers located in the United States. Yearly, they handle 1,200,000 eyeglasses. Their purpose is twofold: to collect, clean, neutralize, designate prescriptions of used eyeglasses and to store and package them for distribution to needy groups and individuals throughout the world. Volunteers include students at the school, lion members, other organizations, inmates at local correctional institution. For more info, check out their website www.njlerc.org If you are aware of medical mission groups who provide vision exams, there is a form on the website for them to order eyeglasses to take along.

Here is how to presort eyeglasses:

Please throw away: eyeglass cases, broken eyeglasses, loose lens, contact lens. If you have a way of disposing these items, please do so. If not, box together and I will throw away.

Box eyeglasses and sunglasses separately as well as reading glasses. Mark on box the contents: Prescription/Sunglasses/Readers.

Do not fill box completely to the top. Glasses will get broken in transit. Use sturdy boxes for storage. Do not use extra large boxes as they become too heavy to lift and maneuver. Do not use garbage bags.

Hearing aids are also collected and given to PA Lions Hearing Research Committee who provide them to a research lab in Western PA.


