#### MESSAGE FROM OUR ENVIRONMENTAL CHAIR

Hello District Members. I hope this finds everyone well and staying warm. Within the last few months, we've had a couple blasts of Arctic air arrive resulting in very low temperatures, windy conditions, downed trees, and power loss. With or without these conditions, there are environmentally friendly ways that we can stay warm without wasting fuel.

<a href="https://natureholdsthekey.com/keep-warm">https://natureholdsthekey.com/keep-warm</a> promotes a green lifestyle and suggests the following tips for staying warm in environmentally friendly ways:

- 1. Increased physical activity indoors or outdoors.
- 2. Enjoy a hot meal. Spicy food may be more beneficial.
- 3. Enjoy a hot drink. It will raise your core body temperature.
- 4. Dress in layers.
- 5. Use insulated curtains in your home. Open them during sunny days and close them as it gets dark.
- 6. Reduce or eliminate drafts in your home.
- 7. Add carpets or rugs. 10% of heat is lost through uninsulated floors.
- 8. Insulate an unused fireplace.
- 9. Put radiant material behind your radiators. A DIY option is tinfoil with the shiny side facing out. This will reflect heat back into the room.
- 10. Hot water bottle or microwaveable heating pad. This is less expensive than an electric blanket.
- 11. Hand warmers.
- 12. Candle heaters. For emergencies <a href="https://offgridsurvival.com/candleheaterradiator/">https://offgridsurvival.com/candleheaterradiator/</a> use with caution.
- 13. Use a humidifier or take a shower and leave the bathroom door open afterwards. Humid air feels warmer.
- 14. Program your thermostat. This can save at least \$66 per year versus not programming your thermostat.
- 15. Snuggle with a significant other or four-legged friend to keep each other warm.

Just a reminder that we will be having an environment photo contest like the one that we had last year. Photos will be submitted electronically during March 1-15 with voting occurring March 16-31 at the district website. The winner will be announced at the district convention. The most notable change is that photos will be a larger size. This also serves as a public relations effort for the district. This is an online competition, and a club officer will submit your club's one (1) representative photo. More information will be forthcoming.

#### **ELIGIBILITY**

The 2022-2023 14-T Environmental Photo Competition is open to all district members in good standing who are amateur photographers. One (1) photo per club in District 14-T may be submitted electronically to **kcallear146@comcast.net** between March 1-15, 2023; subject line should read "**Environment Photo Contest**." Voting will occur from March 16-31, 2023, at **palions14t.org.** Entries submitted before or after the Entry Period will not be eligible.

#### WHAT TO ENTER

Voters are asked to judge images based on originality, technical excellence, composition, overall environmental impact and artistic merit.

To ensure functionality on our submission platform, please submit files no larger than **10 MB** at the time of entry.

All photographs should accurately reflect the subject matter and the scene as it appeared. Photos that have been digitally altered beyond standard optimization (cropping, spotting for dust, reasonable adjustments to exposure, color and contrast, etc.) will be disqualified.

Entries may originate in the .jpg format. Suggested subjects include: nature, water, landscape, or wildlife, that were photographed during 2022-2023, within District 14-T.

If you choose to include people in your submission, you are responsible for obtaining the necessary releases from the individual(s) depicted, and must be able to provide copies of those releases to the Environmental Chair upon request.

#### The following submissions are ineligible:

- Images of captive animals photographed in zoos and commercial game farms.
- Photos that violate or infringe upon another person's rights, including but not limited to copyright and photographs of persons without the necessary consent.
- Photos that contain inappropriate content.
- Images that involve the willful harassment of wildlife.
- Images taken that cause or caused damage to the environment by the photographer; this includes taking photos from areas where human presence is restricted by authorities.
- Images that involve putting any individual or animal in danger.

#### **HOW TO ENTER**

Club entry via email to **kcallear146@comcast.net** with attached photo must also include the name of the club, name of the club member photographer, and contact information for the entrant, including an email address. Club leadership will submit the photo.

#### **AWARD CATEGORIES**

Winning submissions will be selected for the following award categories: One (1) Grand Prize winner Honorable Mention(s)

#### **JUDGING**

Judging will be conducted by district members and visitors to **palions14t.org** during the designated voting period (March 16-31, 2023). District members and visitors may visit the site during the voting period and vote one (1) time during the voting period.

All judging decisions are final. Please do not contact us about the status of entries or judging.

#### **RESULTS**

All winner(s) will be announced at the District 14-T Convention or via another format if the convention is cancelled or rescheduled or conducted electronically due to circumstances beyond control of the district.

#### **PRIZES**

All award winners will receive mention in the district's newsletter and: One (1) Grand Prize winner will receive: \$50 USD gift card

#### YOUR RIGHTS

You will retain all rights to any photograph you submit—including ownership, if applicable.



Before 6/15/23: Make sure club data is accurate for this year (2022-2023). For Example, new members, sponsors, new clubs formed, transfers and other end of year activities specific to clubs are correct and recorded in MyLion/MyLCI

- Make sure every member has an email listed and no shared emails can be used in the new LIONS PORTAL.
- Make sure member birthdays are entered since birth dates in MyLCI will be converted - even the old conversion 1/1/1900 date! Hint: in MyLCI under reports run "Member Information Update Report" and have your members update their info!
- Training is slated to begin in late April 2023 Stay tuned!

#### PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp's Mission

District 14-T clubs are strong supporters of our Beacon Lodge Camp. The Camp's mission and general info is noted below. Consider taking a moment to **refresh** your memory OR **learn** about the camp for the first time. As Lions, we are proud to have our name, "PA Lions" associated with and sponsors of this special needs camp.

**FOUNDER** \_The Founder Carl Shoemaker, a blind individual formed a corporation in Mifflin County which the court approved as a statewide charter August 16, 1948. The name was changed several times, but since 1994 it has been "PA Lions Beacon Lodge Camp" to reflect the camp support from the Pennsylvania Lions and to indicate that the camp serves more than just the visually impaired as when originally formed.

#### **MISSION:**

Our mission is to provide all individuals with special needs the opportunity to enjoy a camping experience encompassing recreational, educational, and personal adjustment. Special emphasis is placed on stimulating interests and appreciation for recreation and learning, and to encourage attempting new challenges. The camp also serves as a reference center for Pennsylvania residents for support services in their local area.

Beacon Lodge Camp shall pursue its mission:

- By providing opportunities for understanding and appreciation through an awareness of natural surroundings.
- By encouraging the camper to participate in and share the responsibilities of a democratic society.
- By helping the camper realize that he/she has significant place in the social pattern.
- By fostering in him/her the desire to participate in All camp activities.
- By developing in him/her a sense of responsibility and respect for others.
- By enabling the camper to learn accepted ways of competing and cooperating with others.
- By stimulating in each camper greater self-reliance, resourcefulness and initiative.
- By helping the camper learn new skills and to explore his/her own capabilities.
- By aiding the camper on the road to self-realization, self-fulfillment, and personal identity.

#### **GOVERNING BODY:**

The Camp is governed by a Board of Directors comprised of Pennsylvania Lions nominated by their respective District Governors, approved by the sitting Board of Directors, and accepted by the State Council. Directors serve for renewable three year terms. The Board typically meets four times per year.

The Executive Committee (comprised of the President, First and Second Vice Presidents, Secretary, Treasurer and Chairpersons of the board committees) meets at the call of the President.
