LIONS OF PA FOUNDATION

The Lions of PA Foundation is here to support all clubs in Pennsylvania!

Records go back to 2002 when the Lions of PA Foundation began providing for grants requests.

Records show that in 19 years, the Lions of PA Foundation granted 167 requests. Of those 167 grants, 14-T received 4 grants for a total of \$42,500 – 1 of those grants went to the Fayette Lions Club in 2014.

With the pandemic, there was a lack of grant requests. Over the past 2 years, the Foundation had funds to carry over.

At the end of June 2021 we still had \$129,112 available for Grants. July 1 \$125,000 was added to that. So we start this Lions year with \$254,000 in the account for Grants.

The Clubs of 14-T give to the Foundation through the fellows, awards and the district projects. But as you can see, our Clubs have NOT applied for grants to help them serve their communities.

As a board member, we approve grants to Clubs throughout the state – if your club has a project and is need of a matching grant, please consider applying for funds.
