A MESSAGE FROM DISTRICT GOVERNOR NATE



Dear Lions of District 14-T,

Happy New Year! January marks not only the start of a new calendar year but also the halfway point of our Lions year. As we reflect on the first half, I want to share some numbers that highlight where we stand and where we need to focus. Currently, our district has 1,132 members—a net loss of 31 members so far this year. We've dropped 55 members and added only 24 new ones.

Membership is a key focus from Lions International, and we need to start thinking creatively and proactively about how we can turn these numbers around. Unfortunately, in some communities, there's still a perception of Lions Clubs as being just "old guys eating dinner together." If we are to survive and thrive in the modern era, we need to shift this perception and adapt.


To do this, we must be open to throwing out what we think we know and start engaging with clubs that have successfully attracted younger members. What are they doing differently? What can we learn from them?

I believe it's time to challenge the misconception that younger generations don't want to serve. On the contrary, younger people are just as motivated to serve, but they approach service in new and different ways. While continuing long-standing traditions and projects is important, we also need to explore the unmet needs in our communities—needs that the younger generation may already see and want to address.

Let's embrace this opportunity for growth and change. Start conversations in your clubs about ways to attract new members, especially younger ones. Be willing to adapt and take on new initiatives that resonate with them. Together, we can build stronger, more diverse clubs that will carry Lions forward for generations to come.

Thank you for all you do, and here's to a successful second half of the Lions year!







There were 15 posters received from East Juniata and 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place was awarded.




