UPDATES FROM LCIF As of 1/30/25

Hurricane Helene

The Wake of Hurricane Helene: LCIF's Response to the Devastating Storm

In late September 2024, families were plunged into darkness when Hurricane Helene tore through the southeastern United States. This storm was the deadliest to strike the U.S. mainland since Hurricane Katrina in 2005, causing severe destruction and heartbreak. Knowing these victims had a long and painful road to recovery ahead of them, LCIF approved 14 grants totaling US\$380,000 in response to Hurricane Helene. This includes 12 Emergency Grants of US\$15,000 each across Florida, Georgia, North Carolina, South Carolina and Tennessee, plus two Major Catastrophe Grants of US\$100,000 each awarded to North Carolina and Florida. These grants helped Lions provide things like water, food, cleaning supplies, toiletries, flashlights and linens.

The essential supplies and physical assistance go a long way in rebuilding the community, but for many, the emotional support can be just as effective. District 35-I District Governor Patty Jean Strong says, "It's not just about the material goods because those things are transient. They need humanity and empathy, and that's what we give."

LA Wildfires

Raging wildfires in California destroy entire communities

- Several destructive wildfires swept through the Los Angeles area of California in the United States are devastating entire communities.
- More than 28 people have died, and more than 180,000 people have been evacuated.
- The fires have burned over 50,000 acres and destroyed more than 16,000 structures, including homes, displacing countless families.
- When a humanitarian crisis of this magnitude strikes, we, as Lions, are ready to help. Right beside us is Lions Clubs International Foundation (LCIF), our global foundation.
- LCIF is mobilizing funds, including 2 Emergency Grants awarded and disbursed for \$15,000 each for immediate relief supplies and a US\$100,000 Major Catastrophe Grant, to empower Lions in California to help their communities recover.
- Lions in California continue to develop plans.

All of these grants are made possible by our generous donors, including many of you. Did you know we reached a new Planned Giving milestone? We hit the US\$10 million mark, with 275 donors joining the Lions Legacy Society. These gifts, along with other contributions, play a significant role in funding our grants.

Anyone interested in supporting California efforts should make gifts to LCIF's Disaster Fund, noting that their gift is intended for California wildfire relief. LCIF is tracking all gifts made for the California wildfires.

Local Lions are in the process of assessing needs and donations will be used to support their relief efforts. Donors may not restrict donations for a specific club or district.

Voting will occur from March 18-31, 2025, at **palions14t.org.** Entries submitted before or after the Entry Period will not be eligible.

WHAT TO ENTER

Voters are asked to judge images based on originality, technical excellence, composition, overall environmental impact and artistic merit.

To ensure functionality on our submission platform, please submit files no larger than **10 MB** at the time of entry.

All photographs should accurately reflect the subject matter and the scene as it appeared. Photos that have been digitally altered beyond standard optimization (cropping, spotting for dust, reasonable adjustments to exposure, color and contrast, etc.) will be disqualified.

Entries may originate in the .jpg format. Suggested subjects include: nature, water, landscape, or wildlife, that were photographed during 2024-2025, within District 14-T. If you choose to include people in your submission, you are responsible for obtaining the necessary releases from the individual(s) depicted, and must be able to provide copies of those releases to the Environmental Chair upon request.

The following submissions are ineligible:

- Images of captive animals photographed in zoos and commercial game farms.
- Photos that violate or infringe upon another person's rights, including but not limited to copyright and photographs of persons without the necessary consent.
- Photos that contain inappropriate content.
- Images that involve the willful harassment of wildlife.
- Images taken that cause or caused damage to the environment by the photographer; this includes taking photos from areas where human presence is restricted by authorities.
- Images that involve putting any individual or animal in danger.

HOW TO ENTER

Club entry via email to **auker3738@hotmail.com** with attached photo must also include the name of the club, name of the club member photographer, and contact information for the entrant, including an email address. Club leadership will submit the photo.

WAYNESBORO LIONS

THE LUNCH PLACE -- Our Story (extracted from their website)

SERVING OUR NEIGHBORS:

The Lunch Place exists to serve the community and surrounding area of Waynesboro, Pennsylvania and to provide a hot lunch to the needy, the lonely, and those seeking fellowship with their neighbors. We are a Christian organization, but we seek to serve all of God's people. The formation of The Lunch Place was the result of an ad hoc committee established by The Waynesboro Area Human Services Council Board and The Waynesboro Area Fellowship of Churches who were tasked with examining hunger needs in the Waynesboro Area. The Lunch Place served its first meals in February 1990 at Christ United Methodist Church using their kitchen and dining area. The program was intended for residents in the community including families with small children and older singles living alone, who because of age and condition, may not qualify for other programs. A key component of The Lunch Place would be that of fellowship and social contact with others."

BY THE NUMBERS:

Since February 1990, The Lunch Place has served 340,528 meals. We are currently averaging 30 meals a day though there have been times when the average was 40 – 50 meals a day. The Lunch Place is open Monday through Friday from 11:30 AM – 12:30 PM at Christ United Methodist Church. The hot meals are prepared by our Chef Kinte Snead and a group of very loyal volunteers who help prepare the meals, serve, and cleanup each day. There is no charge for the meals, but a donation jar is available to contribute to The Lunch Place. The funding for The Lunch Place comes from churches in the area, local businesses, and private donors. The Lunch Place Board of Directors consists of 12 – 15 members. They are responsible for coordinating, supervising, and providing support for the services provided by The Lunch Place."






