Our new service initiative is Mental Health and Well-being, October 14-12, 2025.

Lions and Leos are promoting the importance of mental health and well-being and providing meaningful opportunities to get involved in serving this important initiative.

Mental health is made up of a variety of factors, including our emotional, physical, psychological and social well-being. To best address the need for improved mental health, we must first understand the facts* — and challenges — surrounding mental health.

25% Increase in rates of anxiety and depression since 2020; 1 in 7 Youths age 10-19 experience mental health conditions, though many are unrecognized and untreated; 14% Of adults aged 60+ live with a mental health disorder. Loneliness and social isolation are key risk factors; 20 Countries still criminalize attempted suicide, and stigma and discrimination remain against those with mental health conditions worldwide. One concerns the reporting of club events, anything you do is an event. Club meetings, Board meetings, pancake breakfasts etc. Many clubs I know are more active than the monthly reports indicate and I am concerned one step in reporting is being skipped. When the report is made at the end of an event there is a lot of information entered, but it does not leave the computer and go to LCI until the Report Complete button is selected. The Club Secretary, President or Club Administrator can complete the report. You may be able to go back through such reports and mark them complete, but probably only one at a time. And I think there is a limit on how far back.

Another topic is membership. We are striving to add at least 1.5 Million members worldwide. I have heard it mentioned that three or four new members per club would achieve that goal. But I would like to add that we are looking for members to serve, not only add to our rosters. We are a service club with social aspects of course, not a Social organization only.

And lastly, as always we need Lions for positions above the club level. One of the most important is the Zone Chair. And not only do we need Zone Chairs, we need clubs to support them and participate in Zone Settings. Club President and Secretaries should be at Zone Meetings, and any member is welcome. And the Zone Chairman should be working to keep clubs informed of many District items.

I look forward to meeting the clubs during District Governor club visits.

- Participant Flyer to duplicate & give participants to take home
- Sticker to place on back of winning poster
- Certificates for contest winner and school or youth group


