TO PROVIDE a forum for the open discussion of all matters of public interest; provided, however, that partisan politics and sectarian religion shall not be debated by club members.

TO ENCOURAGE service-minded people to serve their community without personal financial reward, and to encourage efficiency and promote high ethical standards in commerce, industry, professions, public works and private endeavors.

CODE OF ETHICS

TO SHOW my faith in the worthiness of my vocation by industrious application to the end that I may merit a reputation for quality of service.

TO SEEK success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self-respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.

TO REMEMBER that in building up my business it is not necessary to tear down another's; to be loyal to my clients or customers and true to myself.

WHENEVER a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or actions towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

TO HOLD friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

ALWAYS to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state and my community, and to give to them my unswerving loyalty in word, act and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means

TO AID others by giving my sympathy to those in distress, my aid to the weak, and my substance to the needy.

TO BE CAREFUL with my criticisms and liberal with my praise, to build up and not destroy.





6. Secretary provides opportunity for recognition of a Club member by submitting a completed Melvin Jones Fellowship form by the deadline posted.

PROUD LION AWARD

As a member of a Lions Club, you are eligible to earn the "**Proud Lion Award**." There are five (5) requirements to be completed to qualify for this award and your sponsor should help you fulfill these requirements. They are as follows:

1. Attend a Board Meeting
 2. Visit another Club
 3. Participate in a Club Project
 4. Attend a Zone, Region, or District. Function
 5. Invite an approved "proposed candidate" to the Club as a guest.
- These requirements must be accomplished within the first twelve (12) months of your membership. When you have completed all five requirements, you must complete the "**Proud Lion Award**" card and return it to your Club Secretary. The information will be forwarded to your District Governor.

PROUD SPONSOR AWARD

The “**Proud Sponsor Award**” is presented to a Lion that walks a new member through the five steps needed for a “**Proud Lion Award**”. This would normally be the original sponsor, but not necessarily so. If the original sponsor does not accept the responsibility or does not have the time to carry out such responsibility, another Lion may act on behalf of the new member to assist them in achieving recognition and thus be awarded the “**Proud Sponsor Award**.”

2025-2026 LCI DISTRICT GOVERNOR TEAM EXCELLENCE AWARD

The Excellence Award is an achievement not only for the district, but also for the clubs that the district supports. It advances our community service, membership growth and leadership development. It is a holistic approach that strengthens our tradition of service and our effectiveness as leaders.

3. **MEMBERSHIP DEVELOPMENT** – The club achieved a net growth in membership (including Branch club members when applicable OR charters a new club OR charters a Leo club. New members attended an orientation and were properly inducted into the club.
4. **COMMUNICATION** – The club has publicized the club's service activities to the public through local media and effectively communicated activities to club members.
5. **LEADERSHIP DEVELOPMENT** – All officer positions were filled in accordance with the constitution and bylaws by qualified Lions, the club was represented at zone meetings and a majority of the club officers

participated in a leadership training program. The training program could include training offered at the zone, district, multiple district or international level. Online courses from the Lions Learning Center, participation in a Club Quality Initiative (CEP) Workshop or completion of the Certified Guiding Lion course also count toward the award.

6. **CLUB ACTIVITY** – The club has hosted regular and meaningful club events and reported Membership, Service Activities and the New Club Officers in a timely manner.

7. **CLUB IN GOOD STANDING** – The club is not in status quo and international dues and new membership entrance fees have been paid in full. No more than \$50 in any other expense due to LCI is outstanding beyond ninety (90) days.

- ☐ Pledge of Allegiance – recited with dignity.
- ☐ Invocation.
- ☐ Lions Toast.
- ☐ Dinner, if a dinner meeting.

C. Introductions

- ☐ Guests – by President (or Club member hosting guest).
- ☐ Principal Speaker – By Program Chairperson.

D. Program (if there is one) Business Sessions – you start with business at this point. NOTE: Depending on the program, you may want to make a motion to not have business this evening.

- a) *When more than one is present, they shall be recognized according to the Roman alphabetic order of the first letter of their fully used family name. If the first letter is the same, go to the second letter, and so on. If the last names are identical, the same process should be followed with the first given name; if these are the same, then the middle name. In the unlikely event that the two names are identical, the one with the longest association membership shall be given precedence.*
- b) *When more than one is present, the one who served most recently is given precedence, and so on.*
- c) *When more than one is present, precedence should be the same as for Past International Presidents (see (b) above). In the event more than one Past International Director who served during the same term is present, then the criteria specified for (a) should be used.*

SUGGESTED GUIDE IN THE EVENT OF THE DEATH OF A MEMBER OF A LIONS/LEO CLUB

1. When a Lion/Leo passes away, the Club president, secretary, or any other club officer should immediately contact the Zone Chair and provide the following information.
 - a. Full name of the Lion/Leo member. If the member was better known by a nickname or another commonly used name, and if the family so desires, also provide that information.
 - b. If the Lion/Leo was a Charter Member.

- c. If the member previously served on the District Cabinet, as a District Committee Chair, etc.
 - d. Name of the Partner-in-Service
 - e. Name of Lions/Leo Club
 - f. Date of birth.
 - g. Date of death.
 - h. Length (years) of service in Lions/Leos.
 - i. Date of funeral service.
 - j. Type of funeral service (Christian, Jewish, etc.).
2. The Zone Chair shall immediately call the District Governor or Cabinet Secretary to arrange for the procuring of a Lions Memorial Plaque and/or the preparation of a resolution in the memory of the deceased, and for the delivery of the plaque and/or resolution.
 3. The Club President or Secretary or a designated Club officer shall arrange for a Lions Memorial Service with the family of the deceased if they so desire. The Lions Memorial Service is traditionally conducted as part of the wake service, normally concluding the regular wake service.
 4. Lions Club Responsibility – As part of the Lions Memorial Service, the Club should have the following items:
 - a. A 4' X 6' American Flag (cotton), properly folded.
 - b. A Lions/Leo button (the lapel button shall be presented to the deceased by the Club Secretary).
 5. Necrology Participants
 - a. All members of the Lions Club of the deceased.
 - b. Zone Chair.
 - c. Any other Lions/Leos of other Clubs.
