MESSAGE FROM DG KRISTA



Hello, Lions and Leos.

Welcome to a new Lion Year!!! I hope this finds everyone well. I was appointed to fill a vacancy at the District Governor (DG) position due to unforeseen circumstances. I did not hesitate to step up and had fond memories of my first term as DG during 2012-2013. It was a

blessed and outstanding experience then and I'm anticipating similar results this time.

My theme is "Serving with Heart" and my membership encouragement is "everyone bring one." We're entering the second half of Mission 1.5 and our District Governor's Global Action Team (GAT) is being activated to help clubs enhance membership, service, leadership, extension, etc. We'll be scheduling training for club officers, zone chairs, guiding lions, etc. Please take advantage of these training opportunities when they become available.

A few things to note. First, **MARK YOUR CALENDARS**. Our next District Convention is Saturday, 4/3/2027. Our goal is affordability and accessibility! Our venue is scheduled to be a church that is pretty smack in the middle for our four (4) counties. We're applying feedback from the previous convention to fine-tune our Lions' experience. Second, here's dates for our now Saturday cabinet meetings: 7/25/2026 (Landisburg Memorial Park); 11/7/2026 (Lurgan Twp.); 2/27/2027 (West Hanover); and, our final business meeting on 6/12/2027 (State Office). Cabinet participation by clubs and club membership rockstars will be recognized at the cabinet meetings. Third, the club visit schedule this year is very aggressive for the first 6-months of the year. This will enable us to promote goals earlier, to engage clubs with the DG's GAT team, to perform community outreach events to spark new clubs, to train our Lions, to help with service and fundraising projects, etc. Fourth, I've added a Veteran Outreach Coordinator to our committees. Lion Kim Grundon will be performing in this role as we seek to recognize our Veterans' service and sacrifice, provide helpful information, and offer support.

I'm so privileged to be working alongside so many great Lions and Leos who collectively impact our communities in so many great ways. I'm looking forward to catching up with everyone at the upcoming events and sharing stories of Hong Kong. See you soon.

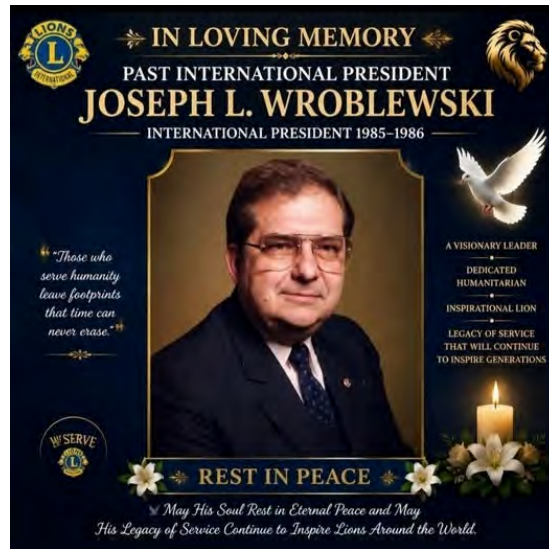

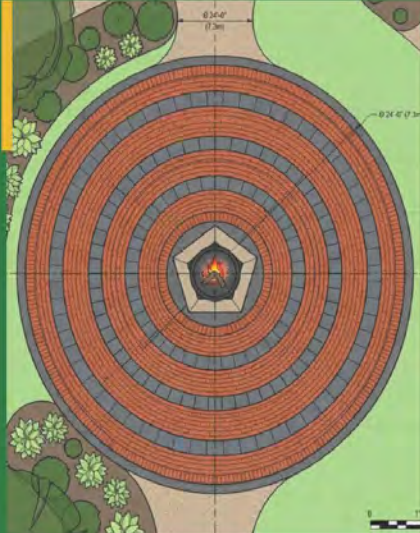

Where Healing Meets Honor

- Phase One (Now Underway)**
Full walkway installation of concentric rings of 4x8 and 12x12 engraved bricks, filled sequentially from center outward. The pentagon fire space remains a gathering place for veterans.
- Phase Two (Coming Next)**
Branch recognition structures with flagpoles representing each military branch placed outside the perimeter, with seating, landscaping, and dedication elements.
