TO SEEK success and to demand all fair remuneration or profit as my just due, but to accept no profit or success at the price of my own self-respect lost because of unfair advantage taken or because of questionable acts on my part.

WHENEVER a doubt arises as to the right or ethics of my position or actions towards others, to resolve such doubt against myself.

TO HOLD friendship as an end and not a means. To hold that true friendship exists not on account of the service performed by one to another, but that true friendship demands nothing but accepts service in the spirit in which it is given.

ALWAYS to bear in mind my obligations as a citizen to my nation, my state and my community, and to give to them my unswerving loyalty in word, act and deed. To give them freely of my time, labor and means

TO BE CAREFUL with my criticisms and liberal with my praise, to build up and not destroy.

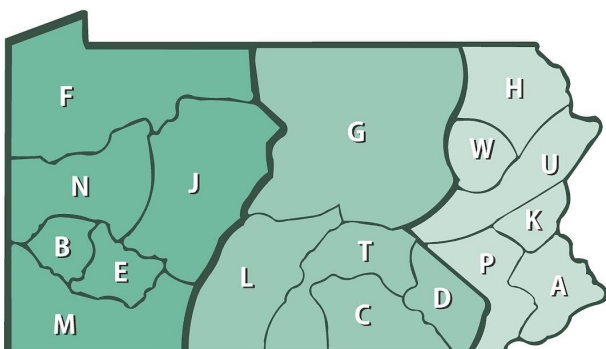

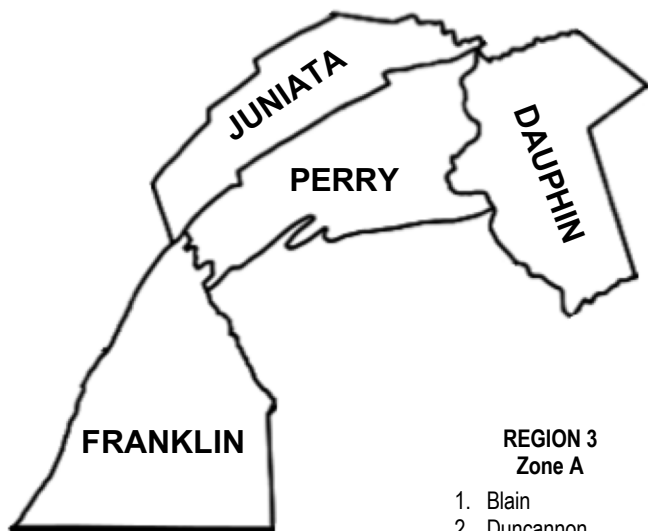

15. **Vision Resources of Central Pennsylvania**, to support and promote the interests of people who are blind/visually impaired and otherwise disabled, and to prevent blindness in Cumberland, Dauphin, Franklin and Perry counties. – www.vrocp.org

16. **Youth Activities** support youth organizations and activities within the District.

PROUD LION AWARD

As a new member of a Lions Club, you are eligible to earn the “**Proud Lion Award**.” There are five (5) requirements to be completed to qualify for this award and your sponsor should help you fulfill these requirements. They are as follows:

1. Attend a Board Meeting
2. Visit another Club
3. Participate in a Club Project
4. Attend a Zone, Region, or District. Function
5. Invite an approved “proposed candidate” to the Club as a guest.

These requirements must be accomplished within the first twelve (12) months of your membership. When you have completed all five requirements, you must complete the “**Proud Lion Award**” card and return it to your Club Secretary. The information will be forwarded to your District Governor.

PROUD SPONSOR AWARD

The “**Proud Sponsor Award**” is presented to a Lion that walks a new member through the five steps needed for a “**Proud Lion Award**”. This would normally be the original sponsor, but not necessarily so. If the original sponsor does not accept the responsibility or does not have the time to carry out such responsibility, another Lion may act on behalf of the new member to assist them in achieving recognition and thus be awarded the “**Proud Sponsor Award**.”

2026-2027 LCI EXCELLENCE AWARDS

2026-2027 LCI Excellence Awards Updates

NOTE: THERE IS NO FORM TO COMPLETE AND LCI WILL SEND THE AWARDS FOR ANY ELIGIBLE ENTITIES – BASED ON EACH CLUB'S REPORTS ON THE LIONS PORTAL.

These prestigious awards are available at four levels—**club, zone, region and district**.

Clubs must earn a **Club Excellence Award as a prerequisite for Excellence Awards at the zone, region and district level**.

Applications will not be necessary for the 2026-2027 award cycle. Awards will be distributed by Lions International to clubs that meet the updated criteria and eligibility requirements. You will find these listed below. Earning the Club Excellence Award is key to becoming eligible for the Zone, Region and District Excellence Awards. These awards will be distributed based on meeting criteria for each category.

NOTE: Lions International will be using material reported through the Lions Portal. Be sure to have reports submitted in a timely manner

Club Excellence Award Criteria

The **Club Excellence Award** acknowledges the dedication and legacy of service within individual clubs and is the foundation for excellence awards presented to Zone Chairpersons, Region Chairpersons and District Governors.

Membership

- Achieve a net growth of two (2) or 10% or more members, whichever is greater (Reinstated members and charter members above the minimum 20 members will qualify.)
- Or sponsor a new Lions club or club branch.

Service

- Report a minimum of four (4) service activities. Three (3) must align with our Global Causes around Youth, Vision and Environment (one in each Global Cause); these service projects can be completed throughout the 2026-2027 Lions year.

Leadership

- Clubs in Good Standing: not in Status Quo or Financial Suspension. Club dues paid and no unpaid balance with Lions International greater than \$50 outstanding 90 days or more.
- Report newly elected club officers for the 2027-2028 Lion year in the **Lions Portal** by May 15, 2027 of the current Lion year.
- Club officers (President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer) to attend instructor-led club officer training (in person or virtual), organized and reported in Learn by GLT coordinator, between March 1, 2026-October 31, 2026.
- The club president for the current Lion year must not have served more than two consecutive terms.

- A minimum of 10% of the club's members complete any three (3) courses in the **Lions Learning Center**.

Donations

- **Contributed to LCIF** a minimum of the club's membership total on June 30 of the previous Lion year, multiplied by \$20.

Zone Excellence Award Criteria

The **Zone Excellence Award** recognizes outstanding Zone Chairpersons who cultivate growth and excellence within their clubs. To qualify, 60% of the clubs within the zone must earn the Club Excellence Award.

District Excellence Award Criteria

The **District Excellence Award** recognizes District Governors who drive exceptional growth, leadership and community impact. To qualify, 50% or more of the clubs within the district must earn the Club Excellence Award, demonstrating commitment to Lions International core principles.

LCI LEO AWARDS

Lions Clubs International offers various ways to recognize Leos for their accomplishments. Go to www.lionsclubs.org, then go to **Resources**, then **Resource Center** and **Leos**. You will find several pages of icons for various Leo awards and other material.

Leo of the Year Award

Leo members that meet the following criteria can be nominated for the Governor's Leo of the Year Award.

To be eligible, the Leo Advisor must submit a Nomination Form with his or her signature as well as the sponsoring Lions Club President and Secretary.

- Demonstration of Leadership Skills.
- Superior record in implementing successful Leo Service Projects.
- Identifiable contributions to the development and growth in the Leo club program by recruitment of 4 Leo members.
- Additional awards or recognitions that the Leo may have received outside the Leo Club Program.
- How the Leo Club Program equipped the Leo for their future (To be completed by the Nominee).

Criteria: LEOLOY 2/21 EN from www.lionsclubs.org

NOTE: Leo Club nominees MUST be submitted to the District Governor by DECEMBER 31. The District nominee (District Leo of the Year) will be chosen and submitted to the State Leo Clubs Coordinator no later than JANUARY 10 or date determined by the State Leo Clubs Coordinator. The MD-14 Council of Governors will choose a nominee (State Leo of the Year) to be submitted to Lions International. The MD-14 nominee MUST be received by Lions International no later than MARCH 1.

Leo Award of Honor

Leos may nominate a fellow Leo member for this award to recognize their outstanding accomplishments during the year. The lapel medal can be purchased from the **Lion Shop**.

Leo Club Pride Award

Leo clubs that have excelled in growing their club, completing service projects and reporting their impact to Lions Clubs International will receive the Leo Club Pride Award. The award will be given automatically based on the Leo club's reported information in the Lion Portal. To be a recipient, Leo clubs have to meet the following criteria by June 30 of the current Lion year.

Leo Club Pride Award Criteria

Membership – Reported a net growth of five new members in the Lion Portal in the Leo club at the end of the Lion year (Net growth: number of new Leo members minus dropped Leo members during the Lion year)

Service – Reported five service projects in the Lion Portal during the Lion year

Organizational Excellence – Reported the Leo club advisor, Leo club president, Leo club vice president, Leo club secretary and Leo club treasurer in the Lion Portal or Leo-72 form for the Lion year

Leo Club President Achievement Award

A Leo club president who meets specific requirements during their year in office may be awarded this certificate by the Leo club advisor with the approval of the sponsoring Lions club president. Award criteria categories include leadership development, membership extension, administration and Leo club activities. Certificate will be emailed to Leo club advisors in May. (Search LEO100 for Criteria)

Leo October Membership Growth Award

Leo club advisors may present this award to any Leo who is reported in the Lion Portal as a sponsor for at least three new members who join during the month of October. Leo club advisors whose Leos meet the criteria by November 15 will be sent the award automatically; no application is necessary.

PROTOCOL

In our Association, we subscribe to “protocol” to demonstrate that we are organized and that we have respect for the fundamental concepts of a discipline, which we have imposed upon ourselves voluntarily. The following are guidelines to be used for conducting a formal Lions meeting in that respect:

THE FLAG AND CLUB BANNER (To be displayed at all meetings):

- U.S. Flag displayed to President’s right.
- Banner displayed to President’s left, or behind podium.

CLUB MEETINGS:

A. Head Table Seating Arrangement (Facing group):

- President – Center or left of podium.
- Speaker/Honored Guest – to President’s right.
- Program Chairperson – to Speaker/Honored Guest’s right.
- Cabinet/District Officers – to President’s right.
- Club Officers – (VP’s, Secretary, Treasurer) to President’s left.

B. Opening of Meeting:

- Welcome everyone.
- Sing first verse of “America” or “Star Spangled Banner”.
- Pledge of Allegiance – recited with dignity.
- Invocation.
- Lions Toast.
- Dinner, if a dinner meeting.

C. Introductions

- Guests – by President (or Club member hosting guest).
- Principal Speaker – By Program Chairperson.

D. Program (if there is one) Business Sessions – you start with business at this point. NOTE: Depending on the program, you may want to make a motion to not have business this evening.

E. If a Business Session:

- Secretary’s Minutes, Treasurer’s Report, Committee Reports, Old Business.
- New Business, Announcements.
- Benediction I followed by adjournment.

PROTOCOL FOR DISTRICT GOVERNOR’S VISITATION

(The Club does not have another speaker or program that night)

District Governor will have a short Board of Directors meeting following the Club meeting. Please be prepared to have it immediately following.

A. Head Table Seating Arrangement:

- President – Center or left of podium.

- District Governor – to President's right (if spouse present, beside Governor).
- 1st Vice District Governor – to District Governor's right.
- 2nd Vice District Governor – to 1st VDG's right.
- Zone Chairperson – to 2nd VDG's right.
- Other dignitaries, Club Officer – to President's left.

B. Introduction of Guests at Head Table:

- President sets protocol and introduces the Zone Chairperson.
- Zone Chairperson introduces 2nd Vice District Governor, if present or
- 2nd Vice District Governor introduces 1st Vice District Governor, if present
- 1st Vice District Governor introduces District Governor (At which time the assembly is to rise and applaud).

C. Program:

- The program will be the District Governor's message.
- There shall be NO OTHER PROGRAM at this meeting.
- The District Governor will meet with members of the Board of Directors immediately after the formal meeting for a brief discussion relative to mutual concerns.

LIONS OFFICIAL PROTOCOL

Leaders (a)

14. Immediate Past Council Chairperson

* *Appointees by the International President to committees of the International Board of Directors and the LCIF Executive Committee shall be introduced and otherwise recognized before Lions who have held the same office. During introductions, their appointment shall be mentioned.*

- a) *When more than one is present, they shall be recognized according to the Roman alphabetic order of the first letter of their fully used family name. If the first letter is the same, go to the second letter, and so on. If the last names are identical, the same process should be followed with the first given name; if these are the same, then the middle name. In the unlikely event that the two names are identical, the one with the longest association membership shall be given precedence.*
- b) *When more than one is present, the one who served most recently is given precedence, and so on.*
- c) *When more than one is present, precedence should be the same as for Past International Presidents (see (b) above). In the event more than one Past International Director who served during the same term is present, then the criteria specified for (a) should be used.*

PROTOCOL FOR INDUCTION AND INSTALLATION CEREMONIES

To avoid unnecessary and lengthy ceremonies, the proper formats to be followed in making awards and presentations should be entrusted to a qualified officer of the Club or other District dignitary.

Gracious Lord, we give you thanks for the day, especially for the good we were permitted to give and to receive. The day is now past and we commit it to you. We entrust you the night; we rest in surety; for you are our help, and you neither slumber nor sleep. AMEN.

His/Her passing is our great loss and he/she will not soon be forgotten, not by his/her Club nor those who have benefited by his/her generosity, his/her hard work and loving service.

God created man and woman for the purpose of serving Him, and as we help others, we serve God.

Perhaps all of us at one time or another have asked ourselves the question "Am I my brother's keeper?"

Lion _____ answered that question by the way he/she dedicated him/herself to helping mankind. The Scriptures state man's life is but three score and ten, and we pass this way but once. Lion _____ journeyed through this land, and we pray that God approved of the work he/she committed him/herself to do. It takes a person with compassion in his/her heart to sacrifice his/her time and talents in helping others and Lion _____ was a person dedicated to that end.

READ 23rd PSALM:

SUGGESTED GUIDE IN THE EVENT OF THE DEATH OF A MEMBER OF A LIONS/LEO CLUB

1. When a Lion/Leo passes away, the Club president, secretary, or any other club officer should immediately contact the Zone Chair and provide the following information.

- Full name of the Lion/Leo member. If the member was better known by a nickname or another commonly used name, and if the family so desires, also provide that information.
- If the Lion/Leo was a Charter Member.
- If the member previously served on the District Cabinet, as a District Committee Chair, etc.
- Name of the Partner-in-Service

- e. Name of Lions/Leo Club
 - f. Date of birth.
 - g. Date of death.
 - h. Length (years) of service in Lions/Leos.
 - i. Date of funeral service.
 - j. Type of funeral service (Christian, Jewish, etc.).
2. The Zone Chair shall immediately call the District Governor or Cabinet Secretary to arrange for the procuring of a Lions Memorial Plaque and/or the preparation of a resolution in the memory of the deceased, and for the delivery of the plaque and/or resolution.
 3. The Club President or Secretary or a designated Club officer shall arrange for a Lions Memorial Service with the family of the deceased if they so desire. The Lions Memorial Service is traditionally conducted as part of the wake service, normally concluding the regular wake service.
 4. Lions Club Responsibility – As part of the Lions Memorial Service, the Club should have the following items:
 - a. A 4' X 6' American Flag (cotton), properly folded.
 - b. A Lions/Leo button (the lapel button shall be presented to the deceased by the Club Secretary).
 5. Necrology Participants
 - a. All members of the Lions Club of the deceased.
 - b. Zone Chair.
 - c. Any other Lions/Leos of other Clubs.

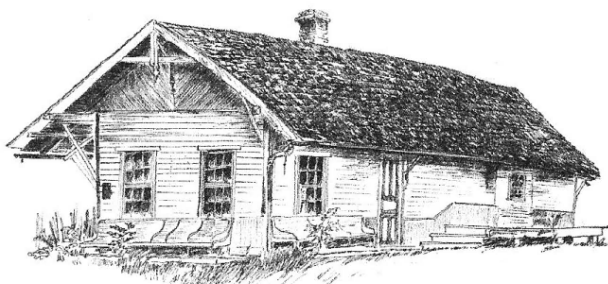
