The Foundation continues to meet four times a year to review Grant Requests. Our most recent meeting was on Saturday, August 8. There were eight Grant Requests to review. Approved Requests include: ● a fire & rescue off-road vehicle; ● playground additions and upgrades; ● a mobile disaster response unit; ● a LifePak CR2 automated external defibrillator package; ● ADA fence for a special-needs playground; ● purchase of food for the community program. Two Requests were tabled for additional information.

The subject of financially assisting the All State Band with future trips to International Conventions was discussed. While the next convention to Washington DC is not an issue, future trips to Minneapolis and to San Antonio could be, the board voted that we could do a matching grant for those trips. The thought would be for future District Governors to consider the All State Band as a District Governors Project and what is raised from the Districts, the Lions of PA Foundation would match that amount. This application insures that we receive the necessary information to consider your request.

Our next meeting will be October 17. If your Club is planning to submit an application, please email it to me by October 1. I will then forward the completed application with necessary signatures to our Executive Director and President. From there the application will be forwarded to the Board Members in preparation for the upcoming meeting.
